#### Robert L. Graham (1805-1887)

Robert L.<sup>i</sup> Graham <sup>1</sup> was born December 21<sup>st</sup> 1805 <sup>2</sup> in Ireland. <sup>3</sup> He married Ann Devor, sister of his younger brother, John Graham (1810-1883), <sup>4</sup> who married Lydia Devor. <sup>5</sup>

Ann Devor was born about 1806 to James Devor and his  $2^{nd}$  wife Lydia Roles in a village near Spring Run Franklin County Pennsylvania.  $^6$ 

- On the death certificate of William A. Graham, Robert was identified as Robert L.
  Graham who was born in Ireland, and his mother Anna Devern (Devor or Deveron) who was born in Pennsylvania. The informant on William's death certificate was his son,
  Stover J. Graham, ii of Huntsdale Pennsylvania.
- The June 14<sup>th</sup> 1880 3<sup>rd</sup> Ward Carlisle Census indicated William's parents' origins were Scotland. This is the only William that matches William's and Agnes's 3<sup>rd</sup> son William. It also correlates to other family members with similar William A. names.

In 1840 Robert's family lived in Toboyne Township Perry County, and by 1850 they had moved to the adjacent township of Mifflin <sup>iii</sup> in Cumberland County Pennsylvania. <sup>iv</sup> Also living with them was a female (possibly Robert's or Ann's sister) who was born 1791-1800.

The family lived in the areas of Mifflin and Hopewell Townships Cumberland Co., adjacent to Toboyne and Jackson Townships of Perry County.

Robert died September  $17^{th}$  1887 at 81 years, 8 months, and 27 days old. <sup>8</sup> He is buried in the Middle Springs Presbyterian Church, Southampton Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. However, there are no Graham names in this cemetery. <sup>v</sup>

Ann died during the 1860's; Robert Graham shows up in the 1870 and 1880 Southampton Township Shippensburg Post Office census living with William H. Watson.

### Mary E. Graham (1834-1863)

Mary E. Graham was born about 1834 to Robert Graham and Ann Devor in Franklin County Pennsylvania.

She 1<sup>st</sup> married Robert French, who was born about 1832 to William French and Jemima Devor <sup>vi</sup> in Franklin or Cumberland County region of Pennsylvania. <sup>11</sup>

Robert must have died after the 1860 census.

After Robert died, Mary married William H. Watson. vii William Watson worked in a paper mill, and was 26 years old at the time, while Mary (Graham) was 32 years old.

Mary and Robert French children included:

- i. Carrie S. French was born 1856. She married a Walterick. viii
- ii. Edith Jane French was born August 25<sup>th</sup> 1858 to Robert French and Mary Graham. She married John A. Walterick. Edith died May 5<sup>th</sup> 1929 in Modena Chester County Pennsylvania. <sup>12</sup>

Mary and her new husband William Watson had two children.

- iii. William G. Watson was born about 1869
- iv. Lillie A. Watson was born about 1871.

vi Jemima Devor is Mary E. Graham's aunt, her mother, Ann Devor's, sister. Mary is marrying her 1st cousin Robert French.
