#### Introduction

I began this research paper based on the marriage between my great uncle Clyde Wrightstone, <sup>1</sup> and Hazel I. Moyer. Hazel's parents were William Augustus Moyer (1877-1942) <sup>2</sup> and Mary B. McCartney.

The death certificate of Mary McCartney-Moyer identified her parents as Jerriah McCartney and Mary Kauffman. The first record we found was the 1880 census record cited in the bibliography. The record had details on the life of Jeremiah McCartney and his wife Mary Kauffman. The record also help demonstrated the connection between the McCartney, Ebersole (Eversole), and Kauffman families. <sup>i</sup>

We assume the name of Jeremiah McCartney (1856-1927) is a family name, and is most likely the name of his father of grandfather. All records for Jeremiah McCartney (1857-1927) indicate his father and mother were born in Pennsylvania, about 1830-1840. These same records indicate the family most likely lived in the eastern region of Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>3</sup>

# Jeremiah McCartney (Father)

In 1800 there is a Jeremiah McCarty living in the East Pennsboro Township area of Cumberland, Pennsylvania. <sup>4</sup> This is most likely the earliest known record of our Colonial American McCartney patriarch.

In 1850 there is a Jeremiah McCartney (b. 1800 in Ireland), working in Fairview Township York County Pennsylvania. Also in 1850, about six miles north, two other Jeremiah McCartney's, both 16, are working as laborers in nearby Lower Allen Township in Cumberland County.

- The 1<sup>st</sup> Jeremiah (b. 1834) was living in the home of John and Mary Dicky in Lower Allen Township Cumberland County, and 15 miles west in Carlisle we have an Elizabeth Dicky living in the home of John and Catherine McCartney. There may a relationship between the Dicky and McCartney families. Everyone was born in Pennsylvania.
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> Jeremiah (b.1834) is living with Mary McCartney (b.1791). Everyone was born in Pennsylvania.

One of these two men is Jeremiah McCartney (1836-1904)<sup>5</sup> who married Nancy Shirk. The other may be the father of our Jeremiah outlined in this paper.

## Jeremiah McCartney (1856 - 1927)

Jeremiah McCartney was born May 5<sup>th</sup> 1857 to Unknown McCartney and Eliza J. Comperfret, (Cornpropst)<sup>ii</sup> in Pennsylvania. His father was born in Pennsylvania, and his mother was born 1833 in Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>6</sup>

It is unknown if McCartney married Eliza Cornpropst, but sometime prior to 1870, Eliza was married to Eversole (Ebersole). If there was a McCartney marriage and death, the Civil War may be a lead to answers.

In 1870 Jeremiah (Jeremia Eversole) was working and living as a farm laborer in the home of his aunt and uncle, Peter Nickel and Mary Cornpropst, in the post office area of Lisburn located in East Pennsboro Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. <sup>7</sup> There is also an Augustus Henry (b. 1855 in PA) working and living with the Nickel family.

Jerry married Mary Kauffman 1876, when the families lived in East Pennsboro Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Mary was born June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1857 to Henry Kauffman and Mary Boyer in Cumberland County Pennsylvania. <sup>8</sup>

In 1880 Jeremiah was a 23 year old laborer. He and his family lived in East Pennsboro Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Also living with the family is Jeremiah's widowed mother, Eliza Eversole (Ebersole), <sup>iii</sup> who was born 1833 in Pennsylvania. Elizabeth's parents were also born in Pennsylvania.

Also, in 1880, Jeremiah's family lived next door to his wife's family; Henry Kauffman and Mary Boyer, and Mary's widowed grandmother, Elizabeth Boyd (Boyer), <sup>iv</sup> who was born 1800 in Pennsylvania. Elizabeth Boyer's parents were also born in Pennsylvania. By 1890 the family moved to the Silver Springs Township and Mechanicsburg areas of Cumberland County Pennsylvania.

Jeremiah was 70 years, 3 months, 29 days old when he died September 4<sup>th</sup> 1927 at his home in Hampden Township. He was laid to rest September 8<sup>th</sup> 1927 at the Brick Church <sup>v</sup> in Enola. <sup>9</sup> FAG#46518961 <sup>vi</sup>

Mary was 79 years, 9 months, 23 days old when she died March 26<sup>th</sup> 1937<sup>10</sup> at the home of her sister, Mrs. Annie Seifert, located at Portland and Walnut Streets, Mechanicsburg Pennsylvania. Funeral services will be held Monday at 2 o'clock at the sister's home. The Rev. Dr. M.R. Hamsher, pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church, will officiate.

Mary's viewing was held March 28<sup>th</sup> from 7 to 9 o'clock at her sister's home, <sup>11</sup> and she was laid to rest March 29<sup>th</sup> 1937, with her husband and daughter, at the Enola Cemetery. FAG#46518973 <sup>vii</sup>

The 1910 census indicated Mary had eight children born, but only seven were still living.

William O. <sup>viii</sup> McCartney was born November 25<sup>th</sup> 1876 in York County Pennsylvania. William married Annie Moyer October 19<sup>th</sup> 1899 in Camp Hill Cumberland County Pennsylvania. William was born 1876 to Jerry McCartney. William is the brother of Mary McCartney, who married Annie's brother, William Augusts Moyer. <sup>12</sup>

When William's mother died in 1937 William and his family lived in New Kingston Cumberland County. <sup>13</sup> By 1940 the family moved to 23 West Simpson Street in Mechanicsburg. His wife had died before 1948.

William was 71 years, 7 months, and 3 days old when he died June 28<sup>th</sup> 1948 from gangrene of the leg and right foot, which was caused by diabetes, at the Harrisburg Hospital in Dauphin County Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest July 1<sup>st</sup> 1948 in the Dillsburg Cemetery in York County Pennsylvania.

ii. Jennie McCartney was born October 31<sup>st</sup> 1878 in West Fairview <sup>15</sup> East Pennsboro Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. <sup>16</sup> Jennie married William H. Vogelsong March 26<sup>th</sup> 1910 in Shermansdale Perry County Pennsylvania. <sup>17</sup> William H Vogelsong was born April 11th 1878 to Henry Vogelsong and Elizabeth McCartney. <sup>18</sup>

When Jennie's mother died in 1937, Jennie and her family lived in R. D. Carlisle Cumberland County.<sup>19</sup> Jennie died June 14<sup>th</sup> 1964, and was laid to rest in the Cumberland Valley Memorial Gardens, Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>20</sup> FAG #109680001 William died October 24th 1969.<sup>21</sup> FAG #109679982

Jennie and William had a son, Marlin F. Vogelsong, who was born May 11<sup>th</sup> 1911 in Carlisle Pennsylvania.

Marlin married and lived in the Carlisle area, where he worked as a car loader for the General Foods Company. He was 45 years old when he died from a cerebral hemorrhage resulting from acute lymphoid leukemia May 25<sup>th</sup> 1956 at the Harrisburg Hospital in Dauphin County Pennsylvania. Marlin was laid to rest May 28<sup>th</sup> 1956 at the Rolling Green Cemetery in Lower Allen Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>22</sup>

Jennie and William also had a daughter, Dorothy M. Vogelsong who was born December 8<sup>th</sup> 1913 in Mechanicsburg Pennsylvania. She married Jacob Deitch and lived in the Boling Springs area of Cumberland County Pennsylvania.

Dorothy loved to grow flowers, was well known for selling plants and flowers, and many sought her advice on growing their own flowers. Dorothy was a member of Otterbein United Methodist Church, Boiling Springs.

Jennie and William also had another son, Paul Vogelsong, and another two daughters, Charlotte Wise and Gladys Brown.  $^{23}$ 

- Mary B. McCartney was born 1881. She married William Augustus Moyer (1877-1942).
  When her mother died in 1937 Mary and her family lived in Hogestown Cumberland County.
- iv. George McCartney was born 1888. George married Lizzie F. Shuler August 3<sup>rd</sup> 1905 in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Lizzie was born to Milton and Mary Shular. <sup>26</sup>When George's mother died in 1937 he and his family lived in Buffalo New York. <sup>27</sup>
- v. Martin McCartney was born May 15<sup>th</sup> 1887 in Cumberland County Pennsylvania. He lived with his parents in 1900. He was a farmer and married, and when he retired he and his family lived at 103 East Portland Street in Mechanicsburg Pennsylvania. <sup>28</sup> When his mother died in 1937 Martin and his family lived in R.D. Mechanicsburg Cumberland County. <sup>29</sup>

Martin was 69 years old when he died of renal failure on April 19<sup>th</sup> 1957 at the Policlinic Hospital in Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1957 at the Stone Church <sup>ix</sup> in Silver Springs Township Cumberland County Pennsylvania. <sup>30</sup> FAG#42745435

- vi. Florence was born 1889, and died 1895. She was laid to rest in the family plot at the Brick Church in Enola Cumberland County Pennsylvania. <sup>x</sup> FAG#46518984 <sup>xi</sup>
- vii. Bertha Maude McCartney was born December 3<sup>rd</sup> 1891 in Cumberland County Pennsylvania. She married William H. Ilgenfritz. <sup>31</sup> At the time of her mother's death in 1937 Berth and William lived at 32 West Simpson Street in Mechanicsburg Pennsylvania. <sup>32</sup> Bertha was 72 years old when she died from a liaison in her bowl at her home on West Simpson Street October 17<sup>th</sup> 1962. She was laid ot rest October 20<sup>th</sup> 1962 at the Mechanicsburg Cemetery. <sup>33</sup>
- viii. Paul Clarence McCartney was born November 12<sup>th</sup> 1893 in Mechanicsburg Cumberland County Pennsylvania. <sup>34</sup> When his mother died in 1937 Paul and his family lived in Detroit Michigan. <sup>35</sup>
