The Condition of this Obligation is,

That if the above bounden *David Einsig of Spring Garden Twp*
Administrat *or* of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of *Arthur*
Einsig deceased, do make or cause to be made, a true
and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the
hands, possession or knowledge of *him* the said *David Einsig*
or into the hands and possession
of any person or persons for *him* and the same so made, to exhibit or cause
to be exhibited into the Register's Office in the County of York, within thirty days from the date hereof, and the same goods,
chattels and credits, and all other goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of *his*
death, which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said *David Einsig*
or into the hands and possession
of any other person or persons for *him* do well and truly administer according to law.
And further do make or cause to be made, a true and just account of *his* said
administration, within one year from the date hereof, or when thereunto legally required, and all the rest and residue of the
said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said administrat *or* account, the same being
first examined and allowed by the Orphans' Court of the County having jurisdiction, shall deliver and pay unto such person or
persons as the said Orphans' Court by their decree or sentence, pursuant to law, shall limit and appoint, and shall well and truly
comply with the laws of this Commonwealth relating to collateral inheritances; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will
