

## Antonius L. Einzig (1804-1859)

Antonius L. Einzig <sup>i</sup> was born to Elias Einzig <sup>1</sup> and Agnes Wiesenfad. <sup>ii</sup> Anton was also referred to by the name of Anthony and Anton. He was christened February 26<sup>th</sup> 1804 as a Katholisch, <sup>iii</sup> in the village of Ahldorf, <sup>iv</sup> located in the Schwarzwald Kreis <sup>v</sup> of Württemberg <sup>vi</sup> Germany. <sup>2</sup>

We think Anton 1<sup>st</sup> married Theresia (Theresa) Findling <sup>vii</sup> on September 15<sup>th</sup> 1840 in a Katholisch (Catholic) ceremony in the village of Ahldorf, located in the Schwarzwald Kreis (Black Forest) of Württemberg Germany. <sup>3</sup>

We aren't certain when Anton emigrated. <sup>4</sup> We know that his wife and three of his children are from Württemberg Germany. Anton was naturalized as an American citizen in York County Pennsylvania, renouncing William the 1<sup>st</sup> king of Württemberg Germany, on October 13<sup>th</sup> 1854. <sup>5</sup>

Theresa died prior to 1845, and Anthony married Elenora Blum. <sup>6</sup> Elenora was born in 1815 in Prussia or Württemberg Germany. <sup>7</sup> Anton married 32 year old Elenora on May 17<sup>th</sup> 1847 at St. Alphonsus Roman Catholic Church in the city of Baltimore, in Baltimore County Maryland.

- There is a source, which also suggests Eleanor's maiden name is J. A. Eleanora V. Schmidtberger, who was born April 21<sup>st</sup> 1815 in the village of Herrenberg located in the district of Böblingen, Baden- Württemberg, Germany. This Elenora died March 21<sup>st</sup> 1880 in York, York County Pennsylvania. We are still attempting to locate the original documents supporting this relationship.

In 1850 Anton, Eleanora, and family lived next door to Jacob Bloom and George Wessafat (Anthony's mother's maiden name is Wiesenfad). <sup>viii</sup> Anton was a blacksmith, and lived with his extended Einsig family in and around Freystown. <sup>ix</sup>

<sup>i</sup> Other spelling of Einzig includes Aensick, Ensick, Eimsich, and Eisig, and the late 19<sup>th</sup> century version of Einsig. Einzig in German means "only". Other uses include; lone, singly, sole, and unique.

<sup>ii</sup> Another spelling for Wiesenfad is Wisafautin.

<sup>iii</sup> Katholisch is not a region, district, or town, but in English means Catholic.

<sup>iv</sup> Ahldorf is a village or small town situated in present day Freudenstadt district, within the Black Forest region. In 2015 it is known as Baden-Württemberg Germany.

<sup>v</sup> Schwarzwald means Black Forest and Kreis means District. In 2015 it is known as Schwarzwald-Baar-Kreis Germany

<sup>vi</sup> Württemberg was a state in Germany, 1806 to 1918, located in the area that is now Baden-Württemberg.

<sup>vii</sup> A family oral history indicated that Teresa Findley is the wife of John Einsig (1831-1915), but this has been disproved; Roy Einsig, Warrington Township York County Pennsylvania; great-great-great grandson of John Einzig.

<sup>viii</sup> The neighbor's names lend some creditability to Eleanor's last name.

<sup>ix</sup> Freystown is in Spring Garden Township, York County Pennsylvania. It was a flourishing community just east of York city; sitting between Philadelphia and King Streets, extending from Broad Street to Sherman Street. Bull Frog Alley was the low swampy area around Fulton Street. Early settlement centered on what is now East Market Street around Ridge Avenue and Diehl's Mill Road (Sherman Street). Freystown became part of York city around 1900.

Anton was ill for nine months with consumption. He was 56 years old when he died from the illness on October 4<sup>th</sup> 1859 in Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania.<sup>8</sup> Anton was laid to rest in the Saint Mary's Cemetery,<sup>x</sup> located in Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania.<sup>9</sup> FAG#:153096645<sup>xi</sup>

In 1860 Eleanora's family lived next door to David Einzig and William Blum (Bloom), who was born 1825 in Germany. By 1870 Eleanora<sup>xii</sup> was living with George and Clara Auble,<sup>xiii</sup> and next door to John Blum and her son Herman Einzig. Herman lived next door to his brother David.

Eleanora lived on the east side of Ridge Avenue in Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania when she died in April 1880.<sup>10</sup> She was laid to rest in the Saint Mary's Cemetery,<sup>xiv</sup> located in Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania.<sup>11</sup> FAG#:153096773<sup>xv</sup>

Anton and his 1<sup>st</sup> wife Theresa Findling had the following children.<sup>xvi</sup>

- i. John Einzig was born about 1837 in Württemberg Germany. He lived with the family in 1850, but by 1860 we were unable to locate him. He was not identified on Elenora's Estate Performance Petition, filed in York County Pennsylvania.<sup>12</sup> may have gone to live in Albany County New York.
  - There were two John Einzig men during this period; 1.) Anton Einzig's nephew, John Einzig (1831-1915), and Anton Einzig's son John Einzig (b.1837), mentioned here, who may be the John Einzig who lived in Albany County New York.. Both John's were listed in the 1850 census record living next door to each other in Spring Garden Township York Pennsylvania.
- ii. Rose Einzig (1842-). She married Henry White.
- iii. Catherine Einzig (1844-1917). She married Leo Mayer.

Anton and his 2<sup>nd</sup> wife Elenora Blum had the following children. The names are listed as written in Elenora's Estate Performance Petition.<sup>13</sup>

- iv. Herman Einzig (1846-1927).<sup>14</sup> He 1<sup>st</sup> married Julia Auble, and 2<sup>nd</sup> Elizabeth Stempley.
- v. George Einzig (1849-1879).<sup>15</sup> He married Barbra Gehring, who he murdered in 1879.
- vi. David R. Einzig (1850-1911).<sup>16</sup> He married Cassandra Killmeyer.

- vii. Amelia Einzig was born June 1850,<sup>xvii</sup> and died 2 months old in August. The cause of death, Inward Fits, which we believe is a baby born breach.<sup>17</sup>
- viii. Theresa Einzig (1859-1922). She married Fredrick Mayer.

#### Rose Ann Einzig (1842-)

Rose Ann Einsig was born 1842 to Anton Einzig and Theresia Findling in Württemberg<sup>xviii</sup> Germany. Rose was only with the family in 1850, and not any other time. She married Henry White. Henry was born 1850 in Pennsylvania.

Rose and Henry signed the May 24<sup>th</sup> 1880 Estate Petition for Elenora Einsig,<sup>18</sup> and the family lived in Freystown as neighbors to Rose's extended Einzig family. Henry was a basket maker.

We were unable to locate Rose or Henry after 1880.

They had no children in 1880.

#### Catherine Einzig (1844-1917)

Catherine Einzig was born April 6<sup>th</sup> 1844<sup>19</sup> in Württemberg Germany.<sup>xix</sup> She went by the name Kate and Katie. Katie married Leo Mayer<sup>xx</sup> June 21<sup>st</sup> 1865 at the Christ Lutheran Church in York, York County Pennsylvania.<sup>20</sup>

Leo was born November 17<sup>th</sup> 1841 to Schantz and Mary Ann Myers in the Baden region of Germany. Leo served as a private in the Civil War as a private in Company C of the 208<sup>th</sup> Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry. He was a carpenter and farmer by occupation, and stood 5' 7" tall with black hair and black eyes.<sup>21</sup>

Since they were married Leo and Catherine lived next door to Catharine's brother David Einsig and his wife Cassandra. Catherine and Leo signed the May 24<sup>th</sup> 1880 Estate Petition for Elenora Einsig.<sup>22</sup>

<sup>xvii</sup> Amelia Einzig parents were not identified. Her affiliation to Anton Einzig is based on the marriages of the Einzig members.

<sup>xviii</sup> Württemberg was a state in Germany, 1806 to 1918, located in the area that is now Baden-Württemberg.

<sup>xix</sup> Catherine's death certificate indicated her father was John Einsig, and an unknown mother. The only John Einsig old enough to have a child in 1844 would be John Einzig (1830-1915). Census records and John Einzig Civil War records disprove Catherine's death certificate.

<sup>xx</sup> Leo's last name should be spelled Mayer, as inscribed on his headstone, and his Civil War Record. Other spellings were Meyers and Myers.

In 1890 Leo Mayer was almost 50 years old when he had sex with his 18 year old niece, Katie Einzig. The affair resulted in the birth of a male child, who was born early Friday morning, October 24<sup>th</sup> 1890, and died the next Thursday October 30<sup>th</sup> 1890. <sup>23</sup> The affair resulted in three individual court cases. <sup>24</sup>

- In the 1<sup>st</sup> case, Leo's wife Catharine filed a charge of fornication against her niece and name sake, Catharine Einzig, who went by the name Katie. Katie was the 18 year old daughter of Catharine's brother, David Einzig and his wife Cassandra. The verdict was not a true bill, and the county of York was to pay the cost of prosecution.
- In the 2<sup>nd</sup> case Katie filed a charge of adultery against Leo Mayer. This case baffles me. Why did Katie file the charge, I would have thought Leo's wife Catharine would have made the charge against Leo for adultery. The verdict was a misdemeanor, Leo was found not guilty, and was ordered to pay 1001.92 in court cost.
- In the 3<sup>rd</sup> case Katie filed a charge of fornication and bastardy against Leo. In this charge Katie was holding Leo accountable for the child born October 24<sup>th</sup> 1890, and died October 30<sup>th</sup>. The verdict came from the 12 all men Jurors on April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1891, Not Guilty.

Leo died May 17<sup>th</sup> 1896 while living in York Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest in the Saint Mary's Cemetery in Violet Hill in York. FAG#:21074845

Catherine was a widow living at 55 Ridge Avenue in York Pennsylvania when she died at 73 years old on April 14<sup>th</sup> 1917. She was laid to rest April 17<sup>th</sup> 1917 at the Saint Mary's Cemetery in Violet Hill in York. <sup>xxi</sup> Mrs. Nora Keller was the informant on the death certificate. <sup>25</sup> The cemetery is located in Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania. <sup>26</sup> FAG#:140214655 <sup>xxii</sup>

In 1900 Catharine indicted she had one child. The census did not indicate if the child was still living.

- i. Joseph Mayer was born in 1863 in Freystown in Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania. In 1887 Joseph worked as a tanner, and lived at 237 South Queen Street in York Pennsylvania. <sup>27</sup> I did locate a Joseph Mayer Death Date: The information came from the Death Records (1893-1906), Date of Death: 02/01/1895, Book:01; Page 316

### Theresa Einzig (1859-1922)

Theresa Einzig was born July 12<sup>th</sup> 1859 to Anton L. Einzig<sup>xxiii</sup> and Elenora Blume in York, York County Pennsylvania. Theresa was living with the family in 1860, and in 1870 her name was listed as Clara living with her mother Elenora and her brother George next door to her brother David in Dallastown York County Pennsylvania.

Theresa married Fredrick Mayer<sup>xxiv</sup> in York. Fred was born October 23<sup>rd</sup> 1852 to Jacob Mayer in Prussia Germany.<sup>28</sup> Theresa and Fredrick signed the May 24<sup>th</sup> 1880 Estate Petition for Elenora Einsig.<sup>29</sup>

In 1880 Theresa and her new family lived next door to her brother David Einzig in Freystown Spring Garden Township in York County Pennsylvania. Fred was a blacksmith, and by 1900 the family lived at 970 East Philadelphia Street in York Pennsylvania.

Fredrick was 67 years old when he died at home on January 27<sup>th</sup> 1920. He was laid to rest January 29<sup>th</sup> 1920 at the Mt Rose Cemetery in York. Florence Myers of 974 East Philadelphia Street York Pennsylvania was the informant on his death certificate.<sup>30</sup> FAG#:151349034<sup>xxv</sup>

Theresa continued to live in the home at 970 East Philadelphia Street in York, when at 62 years old, she died May 11<sup>th</sup> 1922. She was laid to rest May 13<sup>th</sup> 1922 with her husband at the Mt Rose Cemetery in York. Harry H. Keller was the informant on her death certificate.<sup>31</sup> FAG#:151348913

Fredrick and Theresa had 10 children, and by 1900 only 8 were still living.

- i. Catharine Mayer was born about 1875 to Fredrick Mayer and Teresa Einzig. She was with the family in 1880, but not 1900 or 1910. By 1920 she was back living with her parents.
- ii. Johannes Mayer was born May 18<sup>th</sup> 1877 to Fredrick Mayer and Teresa Einzig. Johannes was baptized May 27<sup>th</sup> at the St John's Evangelical Lutheran Church.<sup>32</sup> He went by the name John. John was with the family in 1880, but not 1900.
- iii. Ellen Mayer was born in October 1880 to Fredrick Mayer and Teresa Einzig. Ellen lived with the family in 1880 and 1900, but not 1910.
- iv. Wilhelm Mayer was born January 2<sup>nd</sup> 1882 to Fredrick Mayer and Teresa Einzig. Wilhelm was spelled William, and he was baptized January 16<sup>th</sup> 1882 at the St John's Evangelical Lutheran Church.<sup>33</sup> William lived with the family in 1900, but not 1910, and he was a brush maker.

<sup>xxiii</sup> Theresa's death certificate identified David Einzig as her father, but this was an error. There was only one David at a time to have Theresa as a child; David Einzig (1829-1908). This David's child was named Annie Theresa Einzig, who was born November 23<sup>rd</sup> 1863.

<sup>xxiv</sup> The name Mayer is as it appears on Elenora Einsig's 1880 Estate Petition for Elenora Einsig, and the baptism records of his children. The Mayer name s also spelled as Myers.

- v. Joseph Mayer was born February 16<sup>th</sup> 1886 to Fredrick Mayer and Teresa Einzig. Joseph was baptized February 26<sup>th</sup> 1886 at the St John´s Evangelical Lutheran Church. <sup>34</sup> He was not with the family in 1900.
- vi. Johann Fredrick Mayer was born December 12<sup>th</sup> 1887 to Fredrick Mayer and Teresa Einzig. Johann went by the name Fredrick or Freddie. Freddie was baptized January 1<sup>st</sup> 1888 at the St John´s Evangelical Lutheran Church. <sup>35</sup> He lived with the family in 1900, 1910. In 1920, he and his wife Katie lived with his parents at 970 East Philadelphia street in York. Katie was born in 1886 in Pennsylvania.
- vii. Anna M. Mayer was born November 23<sup>rd</sup> 1889<sup>xxvi</sup> to Fredrick Mayer and Teresa Einzig. Anna also went by the name Annie, and she was baptized December 14<sup>th</sup> 1889 at the St John´s Evangelical Lutheran Church. <sup>36</sup> Anna lived with the family in 1900, but not 1910.

Anna married Mr. Bond. She was 65 year old widow when she died April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1957 at the York View Covalence and Nursing Home in Springettsbury Township, York County Pennsylvania.. She was laid to rest April 25<sup>th</sup> at the Mount Rose Cemetery. Mrs. Josephine Parr, of Deerfield Beach Florida, was the informant on Anna´s death certificate. <sup>37</sup>

- ix. Unknown Myers child died prior to 1900
- x. Edward Myers was born about 1897. Lived with the family in 1900, 1910, and 1920.

The information came from two records: 1.)
