

David K. Einzig (1850-1911)

David K. Einzig ¹ was born August 24th 1850 ² to Anton Einzig and Eleanora Blum ³ in the Freystown area of Spring Garden, York County Pennsylvania.

David was 21 years old when he married 19 year old Cassandra ⁱ Killmeyer ⁱⁱ February 15th 1870 at the St. James Church in York, York County Pennsylvania. Cassandra was born September 1st 1850 in Baltimore Maryland to Jacob Killmyer. ⁱⁱⁱ Jacob was born in Germany. ⁴

David was a brush maker, and the family lived in the village of Freystown, next to his sisters, Catherine who married Leo Mayer, and Theresa who married Fredrick Myers.

On November 5th 1888, Susan Moore filed a complaint with the local Justice of the Peace, Edmund Deitz, against David Einsig and Henry Long. In the complaint Susan Moore of Spring Garden Township said; that on the night of November 5th 1888 in Spring Garden Township David Einsig and Henry Long made aggravated assault by throwing stones at Susan's face.

- The Justice of the Peace issued a warrant to the local constable, Levi S. Laucks, who was tasked with arresting David and Henry for aggravated assault. Henry was placed in jail to wait for the January 1889 Session. David was placed in jail to a wait for a hearing to be held at 2:00 o'clock P.M. on November 8th. During the hearing the Plaintiff's husband Philip Moore and his attorney were sworn in, and after the hearing David was recommitted to jail to wait for the January 1889 court session.
- On November 14th 1888 David's brother in-law, Fredrick Myers, helped David post a \$500.00 bail to appear for the January 10th 1889 court trial.
- Plaintiff witnesses were subpoenaed on December 29th 1888 to appear at 9:00 o'clock A.M., Thursday, January 10th 1889: Susan Moore and her husband Philip Moore, Sarah Jones, William Holland, Mary Meitzel, Margaret Matthews, the constable Levi S. Laucks, Dr. Charles Spangler, and Daniel Mollet.
- On December 31st 1888 charges were filed by the Justice of the Peace, Edmund Dietz, to the York County Court against David Einsig and Henry Long for Aggravated Assault and Battery against Susan Moore.
- Mr. Warner was the attorney for the plaintiff Susan Moore; the Commonwealth. Mr. Bittinger was the attorney for the defendants David Einsig and Henry Long.
- The trial began on January 10th 1889, and then continued for January 16th, which was also continued to January 18th 1889. There is no transcript describing the reasons for each continuance. But the case was eventually continued to 9:00 o'clock A.M. April 18th 1889, and additional plaintiff witnesses were subpoenaed on March 16th 1889: Robert Blum, Lizzie Blum, and Sarah Eishart.

ⁱ Cassandra was also spelled as Lucinda, Cassie, Katrantha, and Catharine was written on David's will.

ⁱⁱ Other spellings of Cassandra's last name: Killmeyer, Kilmyer, Killymore, Kilman, Kilmore, and Gilmore.

ⁱⁱⁱ In the death certificates of Lena and Leo Einsig, Cassandra's daughter and son, Cassandra was born in Holland.

- Witnesses for the defendants included David and Henry, and Gracie Myers and William Myers.
- David's attorney, Mr. Bittinger, declared that there was no evidence that David committed the charge, and that David's wife was confirmed and added to the testimony list.
- On April 22nd 1889 David and Henry were both found guilty as charged. A request for a new trial was submitted. The cursive and untidy hand writing outlining the reasons for a new trial is hard to read. It has to do with four points involving: the verdict is against the evidence; a lack of instructions to the jury on interpreting the evidence; something about the defendants being drunk; and something involving David's wife and childbirth, and a witness not being called.
- Henry Long also wanted to separate his case from David.
- A new trial was held April 23rd 1889, and two charges were heard; aggravated assault and battery and assault and battery. The court found David Einsig not guilty, but found Henry Long guilty of the charge of aggravated assault and battery against Susan Moore. Henry was sentenced to 80 days in jail, fined \$10.00, and ordered to pay cost.⁵

By 1900 the family lived at Ridge Avenue in York Pennsylvania, and later at 51 Ridge Avenue York Pennsylvania.^{iv} In 1910 his sister Katherine Myers, a widow, lived next door to the family.

On January 9th 1911 David made out a will leaving his entire estate to his wife, who he also made his executor. David's sister Catherine Einzig-Mayer, and her husband Leo Mayer, and David's daughter Ella Einsig were witnesses. David's will was executed on October 16th 1911.⁶

Cassandra was 59 years old and living with David at 51 Ridge Avenue in York when she died from Tuberculosis on January 12th 1911. She was laid to rest January 14th 1911 at the St. Mary's Cemetery^v in Violet Hill York Pennsylvania. Her son Leo Einzig was the informant on her death certificate.⁷

David was 61 years old living at 51 Ridge Avenue in York Pennsylvania, when he died from Arterial Sclerosis on October 9th 1911. He was laid to rest October 11th at the St. Mary's Cemetery in York Pennsylvania. His son Leo Einzig was the informant on her death certificate.⁸ FAG#:153096821

In 1900 Cassandra indicated she had 6 children, and all 6 were still living, and in 1910 she indicated she had 9, and 9 were still living. These are the children I was able to identify.

- i. Catharine Einsig (1873-1930). She married Frank M. Hopper.
- ii. Elenora Einsig (1875-1913). She married Edward Stough.

- iii. Philbert John Einsig ^{vii} was born October 31st 1876 to David Einsig and Cassandra Gilmore in Freystown Spring Garden Township, York County Pennsylvania. Filbert was 29 years old and never married. He worked for Standard Chain, when he died from Typhoid Fever on December 28th 1915 at the York Hospital in York Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest December 31st 1915 at the Greenmount Cemetery in York. Filbert's brother-in-law, N. E. Yeaple, was the informant on Filbert's death certificate. ⁹ FAG#:153645260 ^{viii}
- iv. Rosella E. Einsig (1878-1931). She married Daniel S. Cover.
- v. Teresa Einsig was born a twin on January 25th 1880 in Freystown Spring Garden Township, York County Pennsylvania. Teresa was not with the family in 1900 or 1910, and may have died prior to 1900.
- vi. Magdalena Mae Einsig (1880-1948). She was born a twin, and married Stanley M. Foller.
- vii. Henry George Einsig (1882-1953). He married Estella Holmer.
- viii. Lillian was born in September 1882. She was with the family in 1900, but not 1910.
- ix. Leo Einsig (1884-1949). He married Blanch Mae Karr.
- x. Feetie Einsig was born November 1885. She was with the family in 1900, but not 1910.
- xi. Annie L. Einsig (1890-1944)
- xii. Mamie K. Einsig (1892-1954)

Catharine Einsig (1873-1930)

Catharine Einsig was born in 1873. Catharine went by the name Katie, and she may have been named after her father's sister Catharine Einsig who married Leo Mayer. Katie was living with the family in 1880.

In 1890, there were three York County court cases involving Catharine and Leo Mayer, and a Katie Einsig, a spinster. ^{ix} Catharine Mayer is Katie's aunt; her father's sister. Except for the witnesses in the three cases, there were no identifying facts to indicate which Katie Einsig, from which Einsig family, was involved in the three court cases. ¹⁰ But, because the Mayer and Einsig families were neighbors, and the names of the witnesses were from Katie's family; her mother Cassandra, I felt the case involved this Katie Einsig and her aunt and uncle.

^{ix} The legal term spinster in the late 19th century was meant as an unmarried or single woman; Webster's Revised Unabridged Dictionary (1913 + 1828). In 2015 the word spinster or old maid would be considered a derogatory term, and would mean an unmarried woman who is past the usual age for marrying or is considered unlikely to marry; Merriam-Webster Dictionary. An 18-year-old single woman would not be considered a spinster in contemporary language, but a single, 40-year-old woman may be considered a spinster, or old maid.

- Sometime around February 28th 1890 Katie was 18 years old when she had an affair with her 50 year old uncle Leo Mayer. ^x The affair resulted in the birth of a male child, who was born Thursday night, early Friday Morning October 24th 1890, and died the next Thursday October 30th. ¹¹
- On September 12th 1890 Katie's aunt, Catharine Mayer, filed a charge of fornication against Katie. Witnesses for the Plaintiff included: Catharine Myers, Dr. M. J. Kimon, and Cassandra Einsig. On January 6th 1891 charge was determined not to be a True Bill, and the county of York was to pay the cost of prosecution. ¹²
- Then on September 18th 1890 Katie filed a misdemeanor charge of adultery against her uncle Leo Mayer. This case baffles me. Why did Katie file the charge, I would have thought Leo's wife Catharine would have made the charge against Leo. Witnesses: Kate Einzig and Mary Gehring. On January 9th 1891 a jury of 12 men cast a verdict of not guilty in manner and form as he stands indicted, and that the defendant Leo Meyers (Mayer) must pay the cost of prosecution. \$101.91 ¹³
 - Mary Gehring was a neighbor of the Mayer and Einsig families. She was the mother of Barbara Gehring, who was murdered by George Einsig. George was the brother of David Einsig and Catherine Mayer.
- Finally, on September 19th 1890 Katie filed a charge of fornication and bastardy against her uncle Leo. Witnesses for the fornication and bastardy charge included: Catherine Myers, Leo Myers, Dr. M. J. Kimon, and Katie's mother Cassandra Einsig. On April 22nd 1891 a jury of 12 men cast a verdict of not guilty for the defendant Leo Meyers (Mayer). ¹⁴

After the whole affair in 1890, and the 1891 court cases, Katie went to live with her uncle Herman Einzig. Herman and his family lived 25 miles north of York in Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania. Herman's family also had a daughter Katharine, who was born in April 1874. ^{xi}

While living in Harrisburg, 21 year old Katie ^{xii} married 23 year old Frank M. Hopper on March 18th 1895. Frank was born 1872 to J. H. and Lizzie Hopper in New York. ¹⁵

In 1930 Frank and Katie rented a room in a boarding home at 1544 West Broad Street in Columbus Franklin County Ohio. At the time Frank was a traveling salesman of clothing.

Katie was 57 years old when she died December 7th 1930 at the Springfield Hospital, Springfield Township Clark County, Ohio. Dr. Quinn was her doctor. Katie Hooper Death Date, Place of Death: The information came from her death certificate; Clark County Ohio State File Number: Volume: 24-3 Certificate: 70631.

^x A number of Catharine Einsig women were unmarried in 1890. Based on the names and residences, we have determined that this is the correct Catharine Einsig.

^{xi} This Katharine married Eugene F. Fitzgerald in 1899, and the marriage application clearly identified this was her 1st marriage, and her parents names; Herman and Elizabeth Einzig. This helped to separate the two Catharine Einsig women, who were both born about 1874.

^{xii} The marriage application spelled Katie's last name Einsig, and identified her father as John, but the mother's name is unreadable. The Einsig family living in Harrisburg spelled their name Einzig, and there is no John Einsig who had a child Catherine born between 1869 and 1880. This must be the correct Katie, born to David and Cassandra. .

Elenora Einsig (1875-1913)

Elenora (Ella) Einsig was born 1875 to David Einsig and Kassandra Kilmyer ¹⁶ in the Freystown area of Spring Garden, York County Pennsylvania. She was with the family in 1880, but we could not locate her in 1900.

Ella was 30 years old when she married 53 year old Edward Stough on January 17th 1905 in York Pennsylvania. Edward was born 1852 to Adam and Barbara Stough. Edward was previously married, and his wife deserted him, who he divorced on November 23rd 1902. ¹⁷

Edward was a carpenter.

Elenora was 35 years old, living as a widow at 45 East Church Street in York Pennsylvania, when she died October 19th 1913. She was laid to rest September 22nd 1913 at the St Mary's cemetery in York. Milton H. Jacob of York was the informant on her death certificate. ¹⁸ FAG#:153096773 ^{xiii}

Rosella E. Einsig (1878-1931)

Rosella E. Einsig ¹⁹ was born January 22nd 1878 ^{xiv} to David Einsig in the Freystown area of Spring Garden, York County Pennsylvania. ²⁰ She also went by the name Rosa or Rosie.

Rosa married Daniel S. Cover on December 23rd 1895 in Carroll County Maryland. ²¹ Daniel was born April 10th 1864 to John M. Cover and Margaret Taylor in Carroll County Maryland. ²²

- Daniel's siblings included two brothers: John M. Cover of Philadelphia, and William T. Cover of Keymar in Carroll County Maryland; and two sisters: Mrs. William Morrison of Thurmont Maryland, and Mrs. Oliver Billmeyer of St. Louis Missouri. ²³

Daniel and Rosella lived at 1000 West Locust Street in York, where Rosa was a homemaker, and Daniel worked a machinist for the York Ice Machine Corporation between 1903 and 1928, and was a member of the company's Relief association. Daniel was also a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF) lodge at Springfield Ohio and the York Encampment IOOF. ²⁴

Daniel was 64 years old when he died suddenly, Thursday August 9th 1928, at his home from angina pectoris. ^{xv} Funeral services were held August 13th at the home at 2 o'clock Monday morning. Rev. Dr. George S. Sober will be the officiating clergyman. Daniel was laid to rest at the Greenmount Cemetery. His son William F. Cover was the informant on Daniel's death certificate. ²⁵

^{xiv} Rosella's death certificate indicated she was born in 1881, but she appears on the 1880 census record. And there is no other David Einsig that could be her father. Her mother's name was not identified.

Rosella was 50 years old when she died June 28th 1931 at the York Hospital in York Pennsylvania. Rosella was laid to rest July 1st 1931 in the Greenmount Cemetery in York Pennsylvania. Her son John M. Cover, of 1900 West Locust Street in York, was the informant on her death certificate.²⁶ FAG#:88300107^{xvi}

Rosa and Daniel Cover's children included.²⁷

- i. William F. Cover was born September 1896. He married Catharine J. Crimmins on December 23rd 1916 in York Pennsylvania.²⁸

In 1920 William and his family lived with his parents in York, and when his father died the family was still living with his parents at 1000 West Locust Street in York Pennsylvania. William was a block cutter for the local paper mill in York.

William and Catharine children included

- a. Rosella Cover was born February 1918
 - b. William F. Cover was born February 1920
- ii. John M. Cover was born in 1901. He was with the family in 1920, and by 1930 he was married to Susan and living with his mother.
 - iii. Rosella Cover was born in 1905. She was with the family in 1920. When her father died in 1928 she was married to J. T. Constantine and lived in York Pennsylvania
 - iv. Daniel S. Cover was born in 1907. He was with the family in 1920 and 1930.
 - v. Richard R. Cover was born in January 1910. He was with the family in 1928, but not in 1930.
 - vi. James T. Cover was born in 1912. He was with his mother in 1930.

Magdalena E. Einsig (1880-1948)

Magdalena E. Einsig was born a twin on January 25th 1880 in Freystown Spring Garden Township, York County Pennsylvania. She went by the name Lena.

Lena married Stanley M. Foller December 27th 1906 in York Pennsylvania.²⁹ Stanley was born April 6th 1881³⁰ to William Foller and Rebecca Seiffert in Hanover York County Pennsylvania. His father was born in York County Pennsylvania, and his mother in Hanover.³¹

The family lived at 719 State Street in York. In 1920 Stanley worked at an organ factory, and in 1930 in a body shop. By 1940 Stanley and his wife lived at 719 State Street in Spring Garden Township York. While living there, at 59 years old, Stanley died January 20th 1941. He was laid to rest January 23rd at the Mount Rose Cemetery. His foster son Franklin H. Foller, of Lancaster Pennsylvania, was the informant on his death certificate.³² FAG#:110398232

Lena was 67 year old widow living in Windsor Park in York when she died at 9:00 o'clock January 2nd 1948 at the home of her sister, Mamie Seachrist, on Rural Route # 2 Dillsburg area of Warrington Township York County. She was laid to rest January 6th 1948 at the Mt. Rose cemetery in York Pennsylvania. Edward Foller was the informant on her death certificate.³³ FAG#:110398270^{xvii}

Stanley and Lena children

- i. Franklin H. Foller was born 1909. He was a foster son and later adopted by Stanley and Lena. Franklin lived with his parents, and worked for a knitting mill. When his father died in 1941, Franklin lived in Lancaster Pennsylvania.

On November 17th 1943 Franklin went to Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania to enlist in the Army. At the time of his enlistment he was still single. After basic training Franklin was a private in the Army National Guard 317th Infantry of the 80th Army Division.³⁴

- The 317th Infantry Regiment was a regiment of the United States Army during World War II. It was one of three infantry regiments in the 80th Infantry Division. The 80th Infantry Division, Nicknamed the "Blue Ridge Division", was initially composed of draftees from the mid-Atlantic states of Virginia, West Virginia, Pennsylvania and Maryland.
- On August 5th 1944, the 80th landed at Utah Beach. The division was destined to become the "work horse" of General Patton's 3rd Army and to play a key role in the famed 3rd Army breakthrough at Avranches.
- The Division then attacked Argentan, taking it on August 20th 1944, and creating the Falaise Pocket. After mopping up in the area, the 80th took part in the 3rd Army dash across France, cutting through Saint-Mihiel, Châlons, and Commercy in pursuit of the retreating Germans until stopped by the lack of gasoline and other supplies at the river Seille.
- From September 25th to November 7th the division maintained an aggressive defense of positions west of the Seille River, and prepared for the 3rd Army sweep into the industrially vital Saar Basin.
- The attack jumped off on November 8th 1944, the 80th advancing through Delme Ridge, Faulquemont, and St. Avold to within 5 miles of Saarbrücken,^{xviii} when it was relieved by the 6th Armored Division on December 7th 1944.

Franklin was killed November 14th 1944 in action at St. Avold France,^{xix} during the Army's advance into Germany. He was laid to rest at Grave Number: K 30 20; Inscription: 33872683 in the Lorraine American Cemetery and Memorial in Saint-Avold, Departement de la Moselle, Lorraine, France. His brother was listed as his next of kin, and who received Franklin's Purple Heart; Edward Foller of 719 State Street in York Pennsylvania.³⁵ FAG#: 56655069

- ii. Edward Foller³⁶ was born in 1926. When his brother was killed during WW II in 1944, Edward was living at 719 State Street in York Pennsylvania. Edward died in 1992. FAG#:99955576

Henry George Einsig (1882-1953)

Henry George Einsig was born September 25th 1882 to David Einsig and Cassandra Kilmore³⁷ in Freystown Spring Garden Township, York County Pennsylvania. Henry lived with his family in 1900, and worked as a chain maker.

Henry married Estella Holmes about 1906. Estelle was born June 19th 1883 to Ward Holmer and Anna Wharton in Trenton in Mercer County New Jersey. Her father was born in New Jersey and her mother in Pennsylvania.³⁸

In 1910 the young family lived on East State Street, where Henry worked as a chain maker for a local Bridge Company in the Trenton Mercer County New Jersey. By the time Henry registered for the WW I draft on September 12th 1918, he and his family lived at 1924 South Clinton Avenue in Trenton New Jersey. At the time was still working as a chain maker, but his new employer was the Woodhouse Chain Company on 3rd Street in Trenton.³⁹ By 1920 the family was living at 1233 South Clinton Avenue in Hamilton Township in Mercer County New sweater.

In July 1931 Henry and his family was living in the R. D. #1 Bristol area of Bucks County Pennsylvania. At the time he accepted his small inheritance from his aunt, Catherine Mayer, who had died in 1917.⁴⁰

By about 1932 Henry was back living in York. On February 12th 1942 Henry worked for the Troy Chain Company Incorporated, which is located in Troy New York. When Henry signed up for the WW II draft on April 27th 1942, he was 5' 11" and weighed 245 pounds. Henry was still a chain maker, but his new employer was the International Chain Works on Norway Street in York Pennsylvania. Henry lived at 114 Hamilton Avenue in York, while Estella was living at R. D. #1 in Bristol Pennsylvania.⁴¹

In 1941 Estelle lived at 42 North Radcliff Street in Bristol Bucks County Pennsylvania. She was 58 years old she died June 11th 1942 at the Abinton Hospital in Abington Township Montgomery County Pennsylvania. Estella was laid to rest June 13th at the Riverview Cemetery in New Jersey.^{xx} Her daughter Miss S. Einsig, of 42 North Radcliff Street in Bristol, was the informant in her death certificate.⁴² FAG#:70899213

Henry was a widower, living with Susan R. Zepp at 7 North Newberry Street in York, when he died February 21st 1953. Henry was laid to rest February 22nd 1953 in the Prospect Hill Cemetery located in Manchester Township York County. Susan R. Zepp and Reverend Guy B. Creep were the informants on the death certificate.⁴³ FAG#:157503379^{xxi}

Henry and Estella Einsig's children included

- i. Estella G. Einsig was born 1907.

- ii. Genevieve Elizabeth Einsig was born November 23rd 1915 in Trenton, Mercer County New Jersey. She married Mr. Foster. Genevieve died November 18th 1992 in Morrisville Bucks County Pennsylvania.⁴⁴
- iii. Henry Einsig was born in January 1918.
- iv. James R. Einsig was born February 1919. He married Beulah and in 1965 they lived at 10 Tweed Road in Twin Oaks in Levittown Bucks County Pennsylvania. In January 1966 James and Beulah were in a car accident involving a drunk driver on Route 413 near the Snowball Gate exit. They both hit their heads on the windshield, and were sent to the Lower Bucks County Hospital, where James was treated for cuts to the head and release, but Beulah was admitted.⁴⁵

Leo Einsig (1884-1949)

Leo Einsig was born December 16th 1884 to David K. Einsig and Cassandra Kilmore in Freystown Spring Garden Township, York County Pennsylvania.⁴⁶

Leo served in World War I as a private in Company "G" of the 112th Infantry in the 28th Division.

Leo was married to Blanch Mae Karr, and they lived on rural route 2 Dillsburg in Warrington Township York County. Blanch was born in 1889, and she was previously married. Her children were George Karr, Mrs. Herbert Keech, Miss Dorothy Yeaple, and Mrs. Gordon Hoskins all of York.

In 1930 the Leo lived with his wife and step-daughter, Mary, at 232 South Queen Street in York. Leo was working as a laborer in a hotel. Mary was born about 1918. By 1940 the couple had moved about 35 miles north-west of York to 151 D Street in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Mary was no longer living with Leo and Blanch. At that time Leo worked as a laborer for a laundry service.

When Leo died in 1949, his brother Henry Einsig lived in York, and Mamie Seachrist lived in R. D. #2 Dillsburg. No other sibling was identified.

Leo was 64 years old when he died of a cerebral hemorrhage at the home of Elmer Seachrist R. D. #2 Dillsburg on January 21st 1949. Leo was laid to rest January 24th 1949 at the Prospect Hill Cemetery Manchester Township in York Pennsylvania. Guy B. Creep was the informant on the death certificate.⁴⁷

Annie L. Einsig (1890-1944)

Annie (Anna) L. Einsig was born March 10th 1890.⁴⁸ Anna applied for a marriage license on January 30th 1909 and married William A. Test on January 31st 1909 in York Pennsylvania.⁴⁹

In 1910 Annie was living with her parents, where her name was Annie L. Test, and she indicated she was married in 1907, and had one child that was not living in 1910.

Annie was 23 years old when she married 23 year old Norman E. Yeaple on September 16th 1913 in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Norman was born about 1890 to John E. Yeaple and Minnie E. Morningstar.^{xxiii 50}

Anna was 53 years old when she died January 10th 1944 in Spring Garden Township York County. She was laid to rest January 13th at the Mt Rose Cemetery in York. Her husband, Norman, was the informant on her death certificate.⁵¹ FAG#:153645919^{xxiv}

Mamie K. Einsig (1892-1954)

Mamie (Minnie or Naomi) K. Einsig was born November 16th 1892⁵² to David Einsig and Cassandra Gilmore in Spring Garden Township York County. In 1900 and 1910 she was living with her parents.

Mamie 1st married someone after 1910. Her husband deserted her, and she divorced him on August 22nd 1913. She then married Harry W. Seachrist September 3rd 1919 in York Pennsylvania. Harry was born in 1893 to Henry E. Seachrist and Ida M. Rohrbaugh. Harry's parent's died prior to his marriage with Mamie. Harry was previously married, and his wife died June 26th 1919.⁵³

After they married Harry and Mamie rented a place at 323 West Baptist Alley in York, where Harry was a laborer working in a paper mill. By 1930 they moved and rented a place at 327 Reinecke Place in York, where Harry was working at an auto body shop. In 1935 the couple was still living in York at 123 Stanley Place.⁵⁴

By 1950 Mamie was a widow living near her brother Leo, with Robert Forry in the rural R, D. # 2 area of Dillsburg in York County Pennsylvania. She left Robert her entire estate and personal effects in her will.⁵⁵

Mamie was 62 years old when she died December 3rd 1954 at the Polyclinic Hospital in Harrisburg, Dauphin County Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest December 7th at the Evergreen Cemetery in Duncannon Perry County Pennsylvania. Robert Forry was the informant on her death certificate.⁵⁶
