

## George Einzig (1830-1883)

Johann Georg<sup>i</sup> Einzig was born October 9<sup>th</sup> 1830 to Martin Einzig and Catharina Findling. Johann was christened October 10<sup>th</sup> 1830, as a Katholisch in the village of Baisingen within the Schwarzwald Kreis of Württemberg Germany.<sup>1</sup>

George was a basket maker, who came from a family of peddlers who were known to travel from area to area making and selling their baskets, brooms, and hair brushes, or otherwise applying their skills, or as horse dealers. This practice often took them back to their extended Einzig family members in Freystown, York County, during winter months, where the members would manufacture their goods for the following spring when they would begin their travels again.

- The early settlement of Freystown centered on what is now East Market Street around Ridge Avenue, and Diehl's Mill Road (Sherman Street), and was located within Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania; east of York city. The neighborhood Bull Frog Alley was well known and located in the low swampy area around Fulton Street.<sup>2</sup>

George married Catherine Rhinehart<sup>ii</sup> about 1858. Kate was born about 1839 in Württemberg Germany.<sup>3</sup> Catherine went by the name Katie and Kate.

In August 1870 the family was living in Slatington within the Lowhill Township of Lehigh County Pennsylvania. Kate's color was identified as Mulatto.<sup>iii</sup> By the time their son Jacob was born in March 1870 the family lived in Reading Berks County Pennsylvania.

Sometime around the 1880 time frame George moved his family to a small island between the river and canal, near the first lock below Allentown in Lehigh County Pennsylvania. They lived in a rude hovel (a small, squalid, unpleasant, or simply constructed dwelling), and in great poverty and destitution having only the rudest and poorest shelter to protect them from the weather.<sup>4</sup>

On Saturday October 12<sup>th</sup> 1883 George disappeared from home after a drunken debauch of several days. Nothing was seen or heard of him from that time, until the following Wednesday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, when his body was found floating in the canal, some distance below the lock.

The local coroner suggested George was wandering along the canal while in a maudlin state, tumbled into the water, and was drowned.<sup>5-6</sup> George died Saturday, October 12<sup>th</sup> 1883, and may have been laid to rest in the Allentown area.

After George died, Katie gave birth to their daughter Rose on June 27<sup>th</sup> 1884.<sup>7</sup> Shortly after her birth the family moved to the East Donegal Township and Hempfield area of Lancaster County Pennsylvania. They lived in the Marietta and the Columbia areas.

Kate was a 67 year old widow when she died August 25<sup>th</sup> 1906 at the York County Almshouse near York Pennsylvania. Kate was laid to rest August 27<sup>th</sup> at the Mount Rose Cemetery in Spring Garden Township York Pennsylvania. Her son George Einsig was the informant on her death certificate.<sup>8</sup> FAG#: 155598410<sup>iv</sup>

When George died in 1883, it was reported that he had a wife, and seven small children.<sup>9-10-11</sup>

- i. Elenora Einzig was born 1858 in Pennsylvania. She was in the 1870 census. When her brother, George, died in 1937, Elenora was not mentioned as a sister.<sup>12</sup> If Elenora was a daughter of George and Katie, Elenora may have died prior to her father's death in 1883.

Also, there was an Elenora Einzig that married Jacob Ross on September 13<sup>th</sup> 1880 at Saint John's Lutheran Church in York Pennsylvania.<sup>13</sup>

- ii. George William Einzig (1861-1937).<sup>14</sup> He married Mary Ann Lauber.
- iii. Martin Einzig (1862-1959).<sup>15</sup> He 1<sup>st</sup> married Agnes Lauber, and 2<sup>nd</sup> to Sophia B. Kepler.
- iv. Susanna Einzig was born 1864 in Pennsylvania. She was in the 1870 census. When her brother, George, died in 1937, Susan was not mentioned. If Susanna was a daughter of George and Katie, Susanna may have died prior to her father's death in 1883.
- v. Lewis Einzig was born 1868 in Pennsylvania. He was in the 1870 census. When his brother, George, died in 1937, Lewis was not mentioned. If Lewis was a son of George and Katie, Lewis may have died prior to his father's death in 1883.
- vi. Jacob Einzig (1870-1930).<sup>16</sup> He married Rose Myers.
- vii. Catherine Einzig (1879-1941). She married John Rinehart.

- viii. Josephine R. Einsig (1870-1954). She married Allen A. Zimmerman.
- ix. William Einsig (1875-1960).<sup>17</sup> He married Emma Reinhart.
- x. Rose Einsig (1882-1957). She married John Rinehart.

### Catherine Einsig (1869 - 1941)

Catherine Einsig was born about 1879 to George Einzig and Catherine Rinehart in<sup>18</sup> Slatington in Lowhill Township, Lehigh County Pennsylvania. Catherine went by the name Katie, which was also spelled as Cattie. When her father died in 1883, a news article indicated that he had a wife and seven small children.<sup>19</sup>

Katie lived with the family, and by 1890 the family had moved from Lowhill Township to Marietta in East Donegal Township Lancaster County Pennsylvania.

Kate was 20 years old when her mother gave her consent for Katie to marry 28 year old John Rinehart<sup>v</sup> on March 13<sup>th</sup> 1893 in York Pennsylvania.<sup>20</sup> John was born in 1865 to Alexander Rinehart and Rosa Myers in York Pennsylvania. Both his parent's were born in Germany.<sup>21</sup>

- Alexander and Rose were members of the St. Joseph's church in York. Rose was the sister of Ferd Myers of York, and Mrs. Mary Kleinman of York.<sup>22</sup>
  - Ferdinand Myers married Elizabeth (Lizzie) Einsig on March 26<sup>th</sup> 1877 at the Christ Lutheran Church in York, York County Pennsylvania.<sup>23</sup> Lizzie is the daughter of John Einzig and Teressia Berger, and they lived in the Freystown area of Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania. Cora's father Martin Einzig is the 2<sup>nd</sup> cousin, once removed, of John Einzig.<sup>24</sup>
- Rose was about 80 years old when she died November 17<sup>th</sup> 1925 at 2:45 P.M. at her home, 802 East King Street in York Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest November 19<sup>th</sup> at St. Mary's cemetery.<sup>25</sup>

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<sup>v</sup> Kate's sister, Rose Einsig also married a person named John Rinehart, who was born to Alex and Catherine Rinehart.

- Rose's children included: John Rinehart and Mrs. Andrew Rinehart of Lebanon; Joseph and Michael Rinehart, and Mrs. Neal Stough of York; Herman Rinehart and Mrs. E. Harrison somewhere in southern United States.<sup>26</sup>

John was a basket maker and junk dealer, and in 1910 the family lived at 813 Union Alley in Lebanon, Lebanon County Pennsylvania. John's family lived with his sister Jane, and her husband Neil Stough, who have been married since 1908, and have a two year old daughter Hilda A, and a five month old son.

By 1920 the family was renting a home on Front Street in Herndon in Northumberland County Pennsylvania. John was a basket maker.

When her brother, George, died in 1937, Catherine Rinehart was mentioned as a surviving sister living in York Pennsylvania,<sup>27</sup> which was at 755 East King Street.

John was 64 when he died July 7<sup>th</sup> 1929 in York Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest July 10<sup>th</sup> at Mt. Rose Cemetery in York. His bother-in-law, Neil Stough, was the informant on his death certificate.<sup>28</sup> Neil is the husband of John's sister, Jane. FAG#:153645621

Katie's son Michael married Neil's daughter Hilda, and they lived in York County when his father died. Katie's other son Ezra was living 20 miles west from York in New Oxford in Adams County Pennsylvania.

By 1930 Catherine was renting a room in the home of Harvey Thomas at 54 Ohio Street in Johnstown Cambria County Pennsylvania, where she worked as a seamstress. By 1940 she had moved about 43 miles south-east to Bedford in Bedford County. In April 1935 Katie lived in Altoona in Blair County Pennsylvania, and by 1940 she was back living at 42 DuPont Street in Johnstown in Cambria County.

Sometime after April 1940 Catherine moved to the town of Bedford in Bedford County Pennsylvania.

Catherine was 62 years old, with her son Ezra in Saint Thomas Township Franklin County Pennsylvania, when Katie died suddenly on July 28<sup>th</sup> 1941 by the side of the Lincoln Highway in her son's tent.

Catherine's death was caused by a fatty degeneration of the heart, caused by obesity. She was laid to rest July 31<sup>st</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania.<sup>vi</sup> Her son Ezra was the informant on her death certificate.<sup>29</sup> FAG#:160283073<sup>vii</sup>

In the 1910 census record, Katie indicated she had four children, and four were still living.

- i. Unknown child.
- ii. Rosa M. Rinehart was born 1894...not with the family in 1920
- iii. Michael Rinehart was born 1901 to John Rinehart and Catherine Einsig.

Michael lived with the family until he was 26 years old when he married his 22 year old cousin Hilda Staugh (Stough) on October 26<sup>th</sup> 1926 in New Oxford Adams County Pennsylvania. Hilda was born to Neil Stough and Jane (Janie) Rinehart.<sup>30</sup>

After they married Michael and Hilda lived with her parents at 755 East King Street in York Pennsylvania. By 1930 they had a child a month old child. Neil Stough was a junk dealer and all of his sons were laborers in a junk yard. Michael was a basket maker.

Something happened between Hilda and Michael, and when he was 32 years Michael married 21 year old Georgia Woomer on July 29<sup>th</sup> 1939 in Fulton County Pennsylvania. Georgia was born 1907 to Edward Woomer and Anna L. Shanes.<sup>31</sup>

- iv. Ezra A. Rinehart was born in 1903 to John Rinehart and Catherine Einsig.

Ezra was 23 years old when he married 19 year old Myrtle June Bordner on January 3<sup>rd</sup> 1925 in Freeburg, Lebanon County Pennsylvania.<sup>32</sup> Myrtle was born in June 11<sup>th</sup> 1906 to Harvey Bordener and Stella Dorkes in Swatara Township Lebanon County Pennsylvania. Her father was born in Fredericksburg Maryland, and her mother in Lochdale.<sup>33</sup> In 1930 Ezra and Myrtle rented a home at 80 East High Street in New Oxford, Adams County Pennsylvania. He was a reed worked fin making baskets.

Ezra and Myrtle Rinehart's children included:

- a. Robert E. Rinehart was born in 1926
- b. Richard E. Rinehart was born in 1929

## Josephine R. Einsig (1870-1954)

Josephine R. Einsig was born April 21<sup>st</sup> 1870 to George Einsig and Catherine Rinehart in Allentown Lehigh County Pennsylvania. <sup>34</sup>

Josephine married Allen A. Zimmerman <sup>viii</sup> about 1888. Allen was born August 30<sup>th</sup> 1867 to John Zimmerman and Sarah C. Bufflap in York Pennsylvania. <sup>35</sup>

- Allen's father, John, died at 68 years old on November 11<sup>th</sup> 1905 in York Pennsylvania. <sup>36</sup> His mother, Sarah, was born January 7<sup>th</sup> 1843 to Gotleib Bufflap and Henrietta Gavlick in Pennsylvania. After Sarah's husband John died, she lived at 921 East Market Street in York Pennsylvania. Sarah was 84 years old when she died at home on September 7<sup>th</sup> 1927. She was laid to rest September 10<sup>th</sup> at the Prospect Hill cemetery in York Pennsylvania. Mrs. G.H. Lotts, of 1941 79<sup>th</sup> Street in Woodlawn, was the informant on Sarah's death certificate. <sup>37</sup> FAG#:160513685 <sup>ix</sup>

After the couple married, they remained in York Pennsylvania where the first three of their children were born. Sometime after Sarah was born in 1891, and prior to the 1896 birth of their son, Edward, the family lived in Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania. <sup>38</sup> Allen and Josephine were still in Harrisburg when their daughter, Mary, was born in 1901. <sup>39</sup> By the time their son George was born in 1905 the family lived in Holidaysburg, Blair County Pennsylvania. <sup>40</sup> And when their daughter Edna was born in 1907, the family lived in Saltsburg in Indian County Pennsylvania. <sup>41</sup>

By In 1910 the family lived at 48 West Washington Street in Chambersburg. Allen was a horse dealer, and worked as a day laborer. When Josephine's brother, George W. Einsig, died in 1937, Josephine Zimmerman was mentioned as a surviving sister, living in Chambersburg Franklin County Pennsylvania. <sup>42</sup>

In 1930 the family owned a home at 219 South Water Street in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. At the time their daughter, Edna Sackman, and her daughter Phyllis Sackman were living with them. Allen and Josephine were members of the First Lutheran Church in Chambersburg. <sup>43</sup>

Allen was 64 years old when he died May 13<sup>th</sup> 1932 at home. He was laid to rest May 16<sup>th</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. His wife, Josephine, was the informant on Charles's death certificate. <sup>44</sup> FAG#:99330626 <sup>x</sup>

After Allen died, Josephine continued to live at the family home in Chambersburg.

Josephine was 84 years old when she died July 31<sup>st</sup> 1954 at the Chambersburg Hospital in Chambersburg Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest August 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. Her headstone is the same as her daughter and son-in-law; Mary C. and George Funk. Mary C. Funk, of R.D. #1 South Thomas Pennsylvania, was the informant on Josephine's death certificate. <sup>45</sup> FAG#:100304499 <sup>xi</sup>

In 1910 Josephine indicated she had eight children, and seven were still living.

- i. Charles H. Zimmerman was born March 19<sup>th</sup> 1889 to Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in York Pennsylvania.

When his father, Allen, died in 1932, Charles was living in Chambersburg. <sup>46</sup>

Charles was a laborer, and worked odd jobs. He married Rose, and after his wife died he lived at 217 North Franklin Street in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania.

Charles was 71 years old when he died December 11<sup>th</sup> 1960 at the Chambersburg Hospital. He was laid to rest December 14<sup>th</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. His son, Godfrey Zimmerman, of 217 North Franklin Street, was the informant on Charles's death certificate. <sup>47</sup> FAG#:160493783 <sup>xii</sup>

- ii. Sallie Zimmerman was born 1890 to Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in York Pennsylvania. Sallie was 18 years old when she married 31 year old Andy J. Lynch on March 19<sup>th</sup> 1910 in Franklin County Pennsylvania. Andy was born 1879 to J.A. and M.A. Lynch. <sup>48</sup> When her father, Allen, died in 1932, Mrs. Daniel Mickey was living in Chambersburg. <sup>49</sup>
- iii. Albert Zimmerman was born a twin on June 11<sup>th</sup> 1891 to Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in York Pennsylvania. While his parent's lived in York Pennsylvania, Albert worked as a laborer for the Railroad. Albert was 15 years old when he died May 5<sup>th</sup> 1909 from injuries working on steam cars, in Logan Township, Blair County Pennsylvania. Albert was laid to rest May 10<sup>th</sup> at the Oak Ridge Cemetery located in Altoona, Blair

County. His father was the informant on Albert's death certificate. <sup>50</sup> FAG#:20984219  
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- iv. Sarah May Zimmerman was born a twin on June 11<sup>th</sup> 1891 <sup>xiv</sup> to Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in York Pennsylvania. Sarah married Christian Cramer, and the family lived at R.D. 4 Hamilton Township, Chambersburg in Franklin County Pennsylvania.

Sarah was 54 years old when she died May 4<sup>th</sup> 1946 at home. She was laid to rest May 7<sup>th</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. Her husband, Christian Cramer, was the informant on her death certificate. <sup>51</sup>

- v. Edward Zimmerman was born October 27<sup>th</sup> 1896 to Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in Harrisburg, Dauphin County Pennsylvania. Edward never married, and worked as a laborer for odd jobs. Edward was attempting to board a Western Maryland freight train Saturday night February 9<sup>th</sup> 1918. He fell under the wheels, had both legs cut off, and was otherwise injured. <sup>52</sup>

Edward was 24 years old when he died Sunday February 10<sup>th</sup> 1918 at the Chambersburg Hospital, after a train ran him over. He was laid to rest February 13<sup>th</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. His brother, Charles Zimmerman of Chambersburg, was the informant on Edward's death certificate. <sup>53</sup>

- vi. Mary C. Zimmerman was born February 11<sup>th</sup> 1901 to Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in Harrisburg, Dauphin County Pennsylvania. <sup>54</sup> Mary was 18 years old when she married 25 year old George Funk on April 8<sup>th</sup> 1919 in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. George was born in 1894 to George Funk and Anna Snyder. <sup>55</sup>

When Mary's father, Allen, died in 1932, Mrs. George Funk was living in Chambersburg. <sup>56</sup>

After George died, Mary went to live with her daughter's family at R.D. # 1 Saint Thomas in Franklin County Pennsylvania. She was 53 years old when she died January 13<sup>th</sup> 1955 at the Chambersburg Hospital.

Mary was laid to rest with her mother on January 16<sup>th</sup> 1955 at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. Regan Harbaugh, of R.D. # 1 Saint Thomas, was the informant on Mary's death certificate. <sup>57</sup> FAG#:100304611 <sup>xvii</sup>

- vii. Ada Viola Zimmerman was born June 4<sup>th</sup> 1903 to George Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. <sup>58</sup> Ada lived with the family in 1910 and 1920, but not in 1930.

She married John Edward Eckenrode about 1922. Edward was born about 1900. In 1930 the family lived in Upper Pottsgrove, Montgomery County Pennsylvania. John worked as a laborer in a foundry.

When her father, Allen, died in 1932, Mrs. Edward Eckenrode was living in Pottstown Pennsylvania. <sup>59</sup> By 1935 the family was still living in Pottstown, at 30 Reynolds Avenue. Edward was working as a second hand dealer. In 1952 Ada was married, and worked as a grinder for a manufacturing company.

Ada was 49 years old when she died July 29<sup>th</sup> 1952 at the Pottstown Hospital in Montgomery County Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest August 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. Janet Dunning, of 30 Reynolds Avenue in Pottstown, was the informant on Ada's death certificate. <sup>60</sup> FAG#: <sup>xviii</sup>

- viii. George W. Zimmerman was born March 19<sup>th</sup> 1905 to Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in Hollidaysburg in Blair County Pennsylvania. George married Katherine, and

they lived in Chambersburg Pennsylvania. When his father, Allen, died in 1932, George was living in Chambersburg. <sup>61</sup>

On March 30<sup>th</sup> 1934 George was 29 years old when he was drinking, and while drunk got into a fight with another man. During the fight George's skull was fractured, and began to hemorrhage. George died March 31<sup>st</sup> 1934 from the hemorrhaging at the Chambersburg Hospital. He was laid to rest April 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. George's wife Katherine was the informant on his death certificate. <sup>62</sup> FAG#:160493639 <sup>xix</sup>

- ix. Edna M. Zimmerman was born October 12<sup>th</sup> 1907 to Allen Zimmerman and Josephine Einsig in Saltsburg in Indiana County Pennsylvania. <sup>63</sup> Edna was 17 years old when she married Kenneth Sackman in 1925, and they had a daughter, Phyllis, who was born in 1925. In 1930 they lived with Edna's parents at 219 South Water Street in Chambersburg Pennsylvania. When her father, Allen, died in 1932, Mrs. Kenneth Sackman was living in Chambersburg. <sup>64</sup>

Edna and Mr. Sackman parted ways, and Edna married Paul Edgar Nye, and together they sold farm produce. In 1943 they lived at 203 South Water Street in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. Edna was 35 years old when she died May 11<sup>th</sup> 1943 at the Chambersburg Hospital. She was laid to rest May 14<sup>th</sup> at the Norland Cemetery in Chambersburg, Franklin County Pennsylvania. Her husband, Paul Nye, was the informant on his death certificate. <sup>65</sup> FAG#:54608397 <sup>xx</sup>

### Rose Einsig (1882-1957)

Rosa Einsig was born August 13<sup>th</sup> 1882 <sup>xxi</sup> to George Einsig <sup>xxii</sup> and Catherine Rhinehart in Allentown Lehigh County Pennsylvania. Rosa was baptized October 1<sup>st</sup> 1882 at the Christ Lutheran Church in Oley Township Berks County Pennsylvania. <sup>66-67</sup> Rosa also went by the name of Rose and Rosie.

Rose was 16 years old on April 1<sup>st</sup> 1899 when her mother Catherine gave her consent to marry 23 year old John Rinehart.<sup>xxiii</sup> On April 19<sup>th</sup> 1899 Rose and John married in York, York County Pennsylvania.<sup>68</sup> John was born January 15<sup>th</sup> 1880 to Alex Rinehart and Catherine Rinehart<sup>69</sup> in Somerset County Pennsylvania.<sup>70</sup>

In 1920 the family lived on River Road in Mt. Union, Huntington County Pennsylvania. John was working as a fireman for a brick company. John was also a basket maker.

When her brother, George, died in 1937, Rose Rinehart was mentioned as a surviving sister who lived in Middletown Dauphin County Pennsylvania.

By 1938 the family lived in R.D. #3 Lewistown, Mifflin County Pennsylvania. John was 59 years old when he died May 16<sup>th</sup> 1939 at the Lewistown Hospital in Derry Township Mifflin County Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest May 19<sup>th</sup> at the Lewistown Cemetery<sup>xxiv</sup> in Lewistown. His son Owen, of R.D. #3 in Lewistown, was the informant on John's death certificate.<sup>71</sup> FAG#:62591138<sup>xxv</sup>

By 1955 Rose lived at the Hotel Stratford Hotel in Lebanon, Lebanon County Pennsylvania.<sup>72</sup> She was 73 years old when she died December 25<sup>th</sup> 1957 at the Lebanon County Home in South Lebanon Township, Lebanon County Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest December 31<sup>st</sup> at the Mount Lebanon cemetery. Rose's son, Harry Rinehart, of R.D. #1 Mechanicsburg in Cumberland County Pennsylvania, was the informant on her death certificate.<sup>73</sup> FAG#:36654285<sup>xxvi</sup>

In 1930 Harry and Gertrude lived in Granville Township, Mifflin County Pennsylvania. Harry worked as a laborer for a Rayon Mill. By 1940 the family moved to the small town of Maitland in Derry Township Mifflin County. Later they moved to R.D. #3 Lewistown Mifflin County Pennsylvania, where Owen worked in Machine Shop#1 at the Standard Steel Works Company.
