

## George William Einsig (1861-1937)

George William Einsig was born December 14<sup>th</sup> 1860 to George Einsig <sup>1</sup> and Catherine Rhinehart <sup>2</sup> in Schuylkill Haven, Schuylkill County Pennsylvania. <sup>3</sup>

George was a basket maker, and at 27 years old he married 19 year old Anna Mary Lauber on November 11<sup>th</sup> 1887 in York Pennsylvania. <sup>4</sup> Anna lived in Spring Garden when her mother Mary gave her consent for Anna to marry George. Anna was born September 29<sup>th</sup> 1868 to Gabriel Lauber and Mary Myers in Pennsylvania.

Both of her parents were born in Germany. <sup>5</sup> When Anna married in 1887, her father Gabriel was deceased.

In 1910 and 1920 the family lived in the area of Marietta located in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania. When their 17 year old daughter Mary married in 1912, she lived in Bismarck Lebanon County Pennsylvania. <sup>i</sup> When their daughter Agnes married in 1921 George and Anna lived in Marietta <sup>ii</sup> Lancaster County Pennsylvania. At that time George was identified as being disabled.

- George's brother, Jacob Einsig (1870-1930), <sup>6</sup> also lived in this same area during this time.

By 1930 the family was back living in York, York County Pennsylvania, in the home of Michael Lauber and his wife Mary at 810 East King Street.

Mary was a 61 year old, living at 812 East King Street in York Pennsylvania, when she died March 30<sup>th</sup> 1930. She was laid to rest April 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Mount Rose Cemetery in York Pennsylvania. Eleanor Einsig of York Pennsylvania was the informant on George's death certificate. <sup>7</sup> FAG#: 155598533 <sup>iii</sup>

George was a 75 year old widow, living at R.D. #4 York in Manchester Township York County Pennsylvania, when he died August 3<sup>rd</sup> 1937. He was laid to rest August 7<sup>th</sup> at the Mount Rose Cemetery in York Pennsylvania. His son, Samuel Einsig, of 622 East King Street was the informant on George's death certificate. <sup>8</sup> FAG#:151120833 <sup>iv</sup>

According to the 1910 and 1920 census record, Mary had twelve children who were all still living.

- i. Sadie Einsig was born in 1889. She married Charles Reinhart in 1906. Charles was born in 1888, and he too was a basket maker.

In 1910 Sadie and Charles lived with her parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania.

She was not in her brother, Chester's, obituary in 1973. <sup>9</sup>

In 1910 Sadie and Charles had two children.

- a. Paul Reinhart was born in 1908
- b. George Reinhart was born October 1909.

- ii. Frank Einsig was born September 28<sup>th</sup> 1890 in York Pennsylvania. In 1910 he lived with his parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania. <sup>10</sup>

Frank was 23 years old, working as a junk dealer and living with his parents in Columbia Lancaster County Pennsylvania, when he married 16 year old Bertha Braine from Milton in Northumberland County Pennsylvania. They were united on April 10<sup>th</sup> 1914 in Lancaster Pennsylvania. <sup>11</sup>

Berta was born was born in 1898 to Samuel Braine and Maggie Myers in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania. Berth's father was also a junk dealer in Milton, and he was born March 1873 in Allentown in Lehigh County Pennsylvania, and Bertha's mother was born May 1880 in Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania. <sup>12</sup>

In 1900 the Braine family lived at 20 South Turbot Avenue in Milton. They had been married in 1895, and Maggie indicated she had two children, but only bertha was still living. When their son Samuel was born December 17<sup>th</sup> 1906 the family lived in Selinsgrove in Snyder County Pennsylvania. This is the same are their son Samuel died two weeks later on January 2<sup>nd</sup> 1907. Samuel was laid to rest January 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Union Cemetery in Selinsgrove. His father, Samuel Braine, was the informant on his son's death certificate. <sup>13</sup>

When Frank registered for the draft on June 5<sup>th</sup> 1917, he and Bertha were living in Mifflin County Pennsylvania. There he was working as a Junk Dealer. <sup>14</sup> By 1920 he and his wife were back living in East Donegal and working as a laborer for a local Casting Company.

In 1940 their son Raymond was married, and he and his wife and child lived with the family at 89 Penn Street in Milton Northumberland County Pennsylvania.

In April 1942 when he signed up for the Military Draft during WW II, Frank was self employed as a basket maker living at 89 Penn Street in Milton. Frank stood 5' 10" with gray eyes and grey hair, and a ruddy complexion. <sup>15</sup>

When his brother Chester died in 1973, Frank was living on Penn Street in York Pennsylvania. <sup>16</sup>

Frank and Bertha had two children in 1920

- a. Viola Einsig was born in 1915
- b. Raymond Einsig was born in 1918. He married Jean E. and in 1940 they lived with his parents in Milton Northumberland County Pennsylvania. Raymond and Jean had a son, Richard R. Einsig, who as born in 1936.

- iii. Rosie Einsig was born in 1892 in York, York County Pennsylvania. <sup>17</sup> In 1910 she lived with her parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania.

Rosie was 21 years old, living with her parents in Columbia in East Donegal Township Lancaster County, when she married her 3<sup>rd</sup> cousin, 26 year old Ferd Einsig. They united in marriage on January 26<sup>th</sup> 1912 in Lancaster Pennsylvania. When Ferd married he was also living in Columbia, and working as a basket maker. <sup>18</sup>

- o Ferd Einsig was born January 1<sup>st</sup> 1885 to Martin Einsig and Miss. Laurer in York, York County Pennsylvania. <sup>19</sup>

Something happened, and about 1919 Ferd and Rosie separated, and eventually divorced. By 1930 Rosie moved to York, living next door to her parents, in the home of Albert Rineheart, on East King Street in York Pennsylvania. Rosie identified her martial status as a widower.

In 1930 Ferd was living in Centerville located in Center Township, Snyder County Pennsylvania, working as a junk dealer in old iron. He had been married since 1921 to Florence M., and they had five children. <sup>20</sup>

When Rosie's brother Chester died in 1973, Rose was married to Mr. Krout, and they lived at 449 East King Street York Pennsylvania. <sup>21</sup>

- iv. Mary Evelyn Einsig was born August 16<sup>th</sup> 1895 to George Einsig and Anna Mary Lauber in Pennsylvania. <sup>22</sup> In 1910 she lived with her parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania.

Mary was 17 years old, living in Bismarck <sup>v</sup> when she married 35 year old John E. Shultz May 4<sup>th</sup> 1912 in Lebanon, Lebanon County Pennsylvania. John was born 1877 to Edward J. and Rebecca Shultz. <sup>23</sup>

Mary worked as a cook, and she divorced John. She was 65 years old she died June 15<sup>th</sup> 1961 at the York Hospital in York Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest June 17<sup>th</sup> at the Mount Rose Cemetery in Spring Garden Township York. Mrs. Betty Fetrow of 719 West Philadelphia Street in York Pennsylvania was the informant on Mary's death certificate. <sup>24</sup> FAG#: <sup>vi</sup>

- v. Agnes Einsig was born in 1899 to George Einsig and Anna Mary Lauber in York Pennsylvania. In 1910 she lived with her parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania.

Agnes was 23 years old when she 1<sup>st</sup> married Earnest S. Whiteleather on April 2<sup>nd</sup> 1921 in Lebanon County Pennsylvania. Earnest was born 1891 to Samuel Whiteleather and Mary Hilt. <sup>25</sup>

Agnes was 34 years old when Earnest divorced her for adultery on February 20<sup>th</sup> 1933 in York Pennsylvania. Agnes then married 32 year old Edward E. Gatewood on April 17<sup>th</sup> 1933. <sup>26</sup>

She was not in her brother, Chester's, obituary in 1973. <sup>27</sup>

- vi. Chester George Einsig was born July 13<sup>th</sup> 1900. In 1910 and 1920 he lived with his parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania.

When Chester signed up for the WW I Draft on September 18<sup>th</sup> 1918, he was working as a laborer at the Conestoga Traction Company at Chickies<sup>vii</sup> in Lancaster County Pennsylvania. His mother Mary was the person identified as his nearest relative, and she lived in Marietta Lancaster County.<sup>28</sup> Chester was also a native of Hamburg Berks County Pennsylvania.

Chester worked for the North Chemical Company in York Pennsylvania. He married Carrie L. Pittinger, who was previously married. They lived at 2059 Winding Road York Pennsylvania.

Chester was 73 years old when he died Wednesday at the C. Howard Marcey Hospital, Wilkinsburg in Allegheny County Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest at the Mt. Rose Cemetery in York Pennsylvania.<sup>29</sup>

Chester was a step father to Carrie's children.

- vii. Samuel Einsig was born August 26<sup>th</sup> 1902 to George Einsig and Anna Mary Lauber in Carlisle Cumberland County Pennsylvania.<sup>30</sup>

In 1910, 1920, and 1930 he lived with his parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County, and in 1930 York Pennsylvania. He worked as a laborer for an iron works. By 1940 Samuel was married to 29 year old Dorothy (b.1911), and he worked as a laborer fro the WCA work program.

Samuel was married, and the family lived at 318 Wallace Street in York Pennsylvania where he was a truck driver. Samuel was 47 years old when he died at home March 25<sup>th</sup> 1950. He was laid to rest March 29<sup>th</sup> at the St. Paul's Church Cemetery in West Manchester Township York County Pennsylvania. His wife was the informant on his death certificate.<sup>31</sup> FAG#: <sup>viii</sup>

- viii. Harry W. Einsig was born in 1904. In 1910 and 1920 he lived with his parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania.

When his brother Chester died in 1973, Harry was living at 2646 Broad Street in York Pennsylvania.<sup>32</sup>

- ix. Elenora Einsig was born in 1906. In 1910, 1920, and 1930 she lived with her parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County, and in 1930 York Pennsylvania.

When her brother Chester died in 1973, Eleanor married Mr. Waltemyer, and they lived at 610 East Philadelphia Street in York Pennsylvania.<sup>33</sup>

- x. Edward E. Einsig was born July 31<sup>st</sup> 1908 in Hamburg Berks County Pennsylvania.<sup>34</sup> In 1910 and 1920 he lived with his parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County, and in 1930 in York Pennsylvania.

Edward was working as a retail manager, married, 5' 5" tall weighting 135 pounds, and living in Juniata County Pennsylvania when he enlisted during WW II in the Army on June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1942 in Harrisburg Dauphin County Pennsylvania. He became a private, and eventually a corporal, in the 275<sup>th</sup> Military Police Security Company.<sup>35</sup> In March 31<sup>st</sup> 1950 Edward and his family lived in Montgomery in Clinton Township Lycoming County Pennsylvania.<sup>36</sup>

Edward was 63 years old when he died January 25<sup>th</sup> 1972 while living in Lycoming County, and was laid to rest in the Woodward Hill Cemetery.<sup>ix - 37</sup> FAG#:42207602

- xi. Charles William Einsig<sup>x</sup> was born in 1910. In 1920 he lived with his parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County Pennsylvania. He went by the name William.

When his brother Chester died in 1973, William was living at 1789 Spring Street in York Pennsylvania.<sup>38</sup>

- xii. Hilda C. Einsig was born in 1914. In 1920 and 1930 she lived with her parents in East Donegal Township in Lancaster County, and in 1930 York Pennsylvania.

When her brother Chester died in 1973, Hilda married Mr. Stough, and they lived at 332 Chestnut Street in York Pennsylvania.<sup>39</sup>
