John George Einzig (1847-1879)

John George Einzig was born December 4th 1847 to Anton Einzig ¹ and Elenora Schmidberger ⁱ in the Saint Mary's Roman Catholic Parish ² of Freystown, ⁱⁱ Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania. ³ John went by the name George.

- The name John George came from two sources; John came from the 1850 census record, and the Saint Mary's Roman Catholic Parish 1858 census record, and George came from every record since 1860.
- Since Georeg died in 1879, he nor the name John, were identified in his mother's 1880 Estate Performance Petition, filed in York County Pennsylvania. ⁴

John lived with the family, and after his father died in 1858, John began using the name George. In 1860 George was still with the family, and he became a brush and basket maker who lived in Freystown Spring Garden Township York Pennsylvania.

George was known as Greeny, ⁵ who was an alcoholic; typically being drunk early mornings and for days at a time. When drunk, he would become an ugly and excitable ill tempered person, but when sober George would be amenable and a kind person.

In 1870 George lived with his mother on Ridge Avenue in Freystown. He married Barbara Gehring ⁶ on December 27th 1870, at the Saint Mary's Roman Catholic Church, York Pennsylvania. ⁷ Barbara was born July 11th 1855. She was the only child born to Andrew Gehring and Maria (Mary) Weisenfahrt ⁱⁱⁱ in York, York County Pennsylvania. Barbara was described as a large woman, 160 to 170 pounds.

George and Barbara lived with George's mother for about 6 ½ years, and by late fall 1877 Barbara left George, and went to live with her parents. The relationship had not been good; physical and verbal abuse brought on by George's constant dinking. George cited that Barbara was being intimate with another married man. Barbara and her children went to live with her parents in the neighborhood of Bull Frog Alley on East King Street. George would frequently visit Barbara and children, and at times staying for days at a time. ⁸

iii The name Weisenfahrt is also affiliated with Anton's Parents: Elias Enizig and Agnes Wiesenfad. Another spelling of the name is Wisafautin.

i George's father Anton married Elenora Schmidt on May 17th 1847, making George her 1st child. ii Freystown was a flourishing community with a rich history just east of York city, bounded approximately by Broad Street, King Street, Harrison Street and Philadelphia Street. Early settlement centered on what is now East Market Street around Ridge Avenue and Diehl's Mill Road (Sherman Street). Freystown became part of York city around 1900 (sources vary), but not without reluctance.

At about 3 o'clock in the afternoon of Thursday January 2nd 1879, George arrived at the Barbara's parent's house to visit, friends also arrived, and everyone was having conversations. There was no drinking during the visit, and the guest left at around 8:15 that evening. At 8:30 George got up from his chair and went outside, when he returned he pulled a six inch butcher knife out of his coat jacket, and cut Barbara's throat from ear to ear. ⁹ Barbara was 23 years old when she died Thursday evening about 8:35, January 2nd 1879, at her parent's home. ¹⁰

After George murdered his wife, he went back to his home, where L. H. Greenawalt, the constable, found him, arrested him, and took him to jail. When the constable asked George why he did it, George said; "I could not have her, and they could not have her." ¹¹

After the murder trial, George hung himself in the Cell #19 of the York County prison on Saturday April 26th or Sunday 27th 1879 at or between the hours of 10:00 o'clock p.m. and 6:00 o'clock a.m. ¹² George could not read or write, ^{iv} but a letter was found in his cell written in German.

50 people attended the burial of George, when he was laid to rest Monday in an unconsecrated corner of the Saint Mary's Cemetery v in York Pennsylvania. There was no ceremony for the occasion. ¹³ FAG#: 139995615

The locations of were George and Barbara are buried has not been identified.

George and Barbara may have had four children. 14-15

- i. Joseph Einsig (1870-1943). ¹⁶ He married Emma Wire.
- ii. David J. Einzig (1873-1923). ¹⁷ He married Mary Ellen Keller.
- iii. Mary Einzig (1876-1912). She married Orpheus Butcher.
- iv. Andrew Antonium Einzig was born April 23rd 1878 to George Einzig and Barbara Gehring. Andrew was baptized May 5th 1878. ¹⁸ Andrew was not mentioned in the petition for guardianship in 1879. ¹⁹

iv George could not read or write does not indicate he could not read or write German.

Mary Einzig (1876-1912)

Mary Einsig was born September 7th 1876 to George Einsig and Barbara Gehring ²⁰ in Freystown Spring Garden Township York Pennsylvania.

Mary was just short of her 16th birthday when her grandfather, Andrew Gehring, gave his consent for her to marry 21 year old blacksmith named Orpheus E. Butcher on September 24th 1892 in York Pennsylvania. ²¹ Orpheus was born April 4th 1871 to William Butcher and Elenora Gemmill in York Pennsylvanian. ²²

In 1900 Mary's niece Katherine Einsig, the daughter of her uncle David and his wife Mary Ellen Keller, lived with Mary and Orpheus in the old Bull Frog Alley neighborhood of old Freystown; 614 East King Street in York Pennsylvania. Orpheus was still working as a smithy and blacksmith.

By 1910 the family bought a home at 740 East King Street in York; next door to Mary's 3rd cousin, John Einsig, and his wife Maggie. ²³ Orpheus was a smithy at a carriage works. Living with them was 27 year old Andrew Lucks.

Mary was 35 years old when she died at home, 742 East King Street, on May 25th 1912. She was laid to rest May 28th at the Prospect Hill Cemetery in York. Her husband was the informant on her death certificate. ²⁴ FAG#:128508396 vi

After Mary died Orpheus moved to 383 South Albemarle Street in York. He was 68 years old he died October 14th 1939 at the York Hospital. He was laid to rest October 17th at Prospect Hill Cemetery. His daughter, Mrs. Estella Gable, was the informant on his death certificate. ²⁵ FAG#:158548489

In 1900 Mary indicated she had three children, but none of them were still living. By 1910 she indicated she had four children, and one was still living.

- i. Unknown Butcher child was born about May 1893, and died prior to 1900.
- ii. Mary M. Butcher was born March 1894 in Freystown in Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania. Since birth she had jaundice, and was one month old when she died April 5th 1894 at home. She was laid to rest April 7th at the Prospect Hill Cemetery in York. ²⁶ FAG#:158548776

iii. Catherine Estella Butcher ^{vii} was born April 1st 1901 ²⁷to Orpheus Butcher and Mary Einsig in York Pennsylvania.

Catherine ^{viii} was 18 years old when she married Willis Gable ^{ix} on July 5th 1919 in York Pennsylvania. ²⁸ Willis Eugene Gable was born April 6th 1900 to John W. and Cora E. Gable in York Pennsylvania. ²⁹

After they married the couple went to live with Willis's parents, where Willis was a laborer for a chain manufacturer; General Machine Works on Market Street in York. By 1930 the still lived in the area at 383 Albemarle Street in York, where Willis worked as an operator in a movie house.

In 1940 the family lived at 900 East King Street in York. Willis was a truck driver for the Motor Express Company.

Catherine died in February 1979. 30
