## John George Einsig Jr. (1864-1939)

John George Einzig Jr. was born July 8<sup>th</sup> 1864 to John George Einsig<sup>1</sup> and Teresa Berger in the Freystown<sup>i</sup> area of Spring Garden Township York County Pennsylvania.<sup>2</sup>

John was 18 years old when he married 19 year old Elizabeth (Lizzie) Ritter <sup>3</sup> on April 6<sup>th</sup> 1882. <sup>ii</sup>

On July 30<sup>th</sup> 1898 Charles Geiger of Spring Garden Township made out a sworn statement against Samuel Matson and Elizabeth Einsig<sup>4</sup> on the charge of adultery against Samuel's wife, Annie Matson.

- Samuel Matson being a married man and having a wife in full life did have Carnal Knowledge of the body of one Elizabeth Einsig. On the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> days of July 1898, and on various other times, then by did commit the crime of adultery. Contrary to an act of the assembly in such cases made and provided and further saith not.
- On August 1<sup>st</sup> 1898 Samuel posted \$300.00 to appear at 9:00 A.M. on October 18<sup>th</sup> 1898 for indictment No. 97 of the York County Court August 1898 Session, in the case of the Commonwealth verse Samuel Matson on the charge of adultery.
- On October 6<sup>th</sup> all of the witnesses had been provided a Subpoena to appear at 9:00 A.M Tuesday October 18<sup>th</sup> 1989for the York County Court August 1898 Session.
  - Witness included: Charles Geiger, John Einsig (Lizzie's Husband), George and Kate New (Kate is John and Jacob Einsig's Sister), G. B. Billet, L. B. Clark, Annie Matson (Wife of Samuel Matson), Jacob Einsig (John's Brother), Caroline Boyer, and M. A. Owens.
- The Inquest: Samuel Matson, yeoman, on the 27<sup>th</sup> of July 1898 did commit adultery with a certain Elizabeth Einzig, and did then and there have unlawful carnal knowledge of the body of her, the said Elizabeth Einzig; he, the said Samuel Matson, being then and there on the day and year aforesaid, a married man, having a wife in full life, to wit, Annie Matson, and she, the said Elizabeth Einzig, not being then and there his said wife, contrary to the form of the act of the General Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- Samuel was found guilty, and a plea was obtained, reconciliation was rendered, and the witnesses were discharged on October 18<sup>th</sup> 1898. <sup>5</sup>

Freystown became part of York city around 1900 (sources vary), but not without reluctance.

In October 19<sup>th</sup> 1898 John Einsig obtained a lawyer and filed a petition for a divorce from Elizabeth Ritter-Einsig. The Petition for divorce was awarded to John based on the adultery case, and John's divorce was finalized on February 27<sup>th</sup> 1899. <sup>6</sup> These events may have clouded the birth of Edward B. Einsig, and who his real birth parents were.

On October  $20^{\text{th}}$  1898 Elizabeth charged John with not providing, non maintenance, for her and her children, as ordered by the court. John paid \$300.00, and was to continue paying \$2.50 per week for child support.<sup>7</sup>

In 1900 John was not living with Lizzie. John identified his marital status as married, and he was living with his parents at 26 Sherman Street in York Pennsylvania. Living with them was Andrew Einsig, who was also listed as being married.

In 1900 Lizzie was going by the name of Lizzie Ritter. She identified herself as being divorced. She and her Einsig children were living in the home of Samuel and Annie Matson at 219 Girard Avenue in York Pennsylvania.

Andrew's wife Ella was living with her mother, Mary New, at 598 East King Street in York. Ella continued to live with her mother and by 1910 she and her mother, and Ella's son James A., lived at the rear of 514 East King Street. James went by the name Andrew J. Einsig. Ella's husband Andrew was living a few blocks East with his father John Einsig Sr. at 204 south Sherman Street in York.<sup>8</sup>

By 1910 John identified his marital status as a widower, and he was living at the York County Almshouse and House of Employment, which is where he lived until near his death, when he died in 1939. From 1910, up to and including his death certificate, John indicated that he was a widower. According to the marriage applications of his children, he was an invalid (Edward's app), living at the county Almshouse.

By 1910 Lizzie went by the name Matson, living with Samuel on Girard Avenue in York Pennsylvania. She also had three more children. One child Edward B., was identified as an Einsig in 1900, but in 1910 to 1940, went by the name Matson.

Elizabeth Ritter-Einsig-Matson was 67 years old when she died on November 17<sup>th</sup> 1931 while living at 734 South Edgar Street in York Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest November 20<sup>th</sup> at the Prospect Hill Cemetery in York. Charles A. Fackler of 734 South Edgar Street in York was the informant on her death certificate. <sup>9</sup> FAG#: 155092322

John was 75 years old, when he died November 1<sup>st</sup> 1939 at the York County Home in Springettsbury Township York County Pennsylvania. John was laid to rest on November 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Prospect Hill Cemetery. The superintendent of the York County Home, Perry F. Smell, was the informant on the death certificate. <sup>10</sup> The death certificate also indicated John was a widower, and his wife was; late-Elizabeth Einsig. FAG#:153937547 <sup>iii</sup>

In the 1900 Lizzie made no indication to how many children she had. However, there were six children living with her in the Samuel and Annie Matson home. By 1910 Lizzie indicated she had ten children, and nine were still living.

• We believe Lizzie had six children with John Einsig, and four children with Samuel Matson. This accounts for Edward being Samuel's child, based on Samuel's adultery, John's divorce from Lizzie, and Edward going by the name Matson.

John and Lizzie had five children.

- i. John Edward Einsig Sr. (1882-1951).<sup>11</sup> He married Marguerite ("Maggie") Lauber.
- ii. Jacob Einsig (1884-1969). <sup>12</sup> He married Bernetta M. Wolford.
- iii. Ida Elizabeth Einsig (1886-1972). She married Norman E. Spangler.
- Anna Einsig was born September 19<sup>th</sup> 1889. She died October 30<sup>th</sup> 1892 in York. She was laid to rest at the Prospect Hill Cemetery. <sup>iv</sup> FAG#:155159050
- v. Margaret Einsig (1891-1984). She married Joseph Klyeman.

# Ida Elizabeth Einsig (1886-1972)

Ida Elizabeth <sup>13</sup> Einsig was born in July 13<sup>th</sup> 1886. <sup>14</sup> Ida lived with her mother Lizzie at 323 Girard Avenue. Ida was living with Norman Spangler, and when Ida was 19 years old, Lizzie gave her consent for Ida to marry 21 year old Norman E. Spangler on June 17<sup>th</sup> 1907 in York Pennsylvania. Norman's parents were Charles and Rosie M. Spangler. <sup>15</sup> Norman Eugene Spangler was born July 11<sup>th</sup> 1885 to Charles Spangler and Rosie M. Yohe <sup>16</sup> in York County Pennsylvania. <sup>17</sup> - <sup>18</sup>

In 1910 Ida and Norman were living with Alexander Matson and his family, the brother of Samuel Matson <sup>19</sup> who married Ida's mother Lizzie Ritter-Einsig, at 532 Loucks Street in Spring Garden Township in York Pennsylvania.

When Norman signed up for the WW I draft in 1918, he and his wife Ida were living at 401 North Queen Street in York Pennsylvania. At the time he indicated he was a drover for the York Sanitary Reduction Company.<sup>20</sup> In 1920 they were still living at 401 North Queen Street in York, where Norman was still working for a Garbage Contractor.

By 1930 Norman and Ida had been divorced. We could not locate Ida, but Norman was living in the home of a divorcee, Bessie Buckingham, at 403 Newberry Street in York, where he was a laborer for a gas company.

By1940 Ida was identified as being divorced and working as a house keeper in the home of a widower, George Fake, at 277 South Newberry Street in York.

Norman went to live with his sister, Annie Spangler-White at 332 Pershing Avenue in York. He would then live at the Pleasant Acres home in the rural area of Springettsbury Township York County Pennsylvania. There, at 69 years old, he died October 1<sup>st</sup> 1954. He was laid to rest October 4<sup>th</sup> at the Prospect Hill Cemetery.<sup>21</sup>

Ida died January 3<sup>rd</sup> 1972 in York Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest at the Prospect Hill Cemetery in York. <sup>22</sup> FAG#:143796100

Children:

Dorothy M. Spangler was born about 1908. She married Elmer W. Beakler on December 2<sup>nd</sup> 1933 in York Pennsylvania. <sup>23</sup>

### Margaret Einsig (1891-1984)

Margaret (Maggie) Einsig was born in January 1891. Maggie was 18 years old and living at 323 Girard Avenue, when her father, John Einsig, gave his consent for her to marry 33 year old Joseph Klyeman on November 22<sup>nd</sup> 1909 in York Pennsylvania.<sup>24</sup>

Joseph was born August 21<sup>st</sup> 1876 to Jacob Klyeman and Mary Myers in Milton in Northumberland Count Pennsylvania.<sup>25</sup>

Maggie was still living in December 31<sup>st</sup> 1973 when her half brother, George Matson died. <sup>26</sup>

Joseph and Maggie lived at 334 South Sherman Street in York, when at 64 years old, Joe died November 18<sup>th</sup> 1940. He was laid to rest November 21<sup>st</sup> at the Mt. Zion Church Cemetery in Springettsbury Township, York County Pennsylvania. Harry Klyeman of 879 East Popular Street in York was the informant on Joseph's death certificate.<sup>27</sup> FAG#:50598441

Maggie died in 1984, and was laid to rest with her husband at the Mt. Zion Church Cemetery. FAG#:50598442.

Maggie and Joseph children included:

- Joseph Clarence Klyman (Klyeman) was born and died October 27<sup>th</sup> 1911 in York Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest October 28<sup>th</sup> at the Saint Mary's Cemetery <sup>v</sup>in York Pennsylvania. His father was the informant on his death certificate. <sup>28</sup> FAG#:155159565
- ii. Lillian Klyeman was born in 1922.
- Vi. Katie Einsig was born in April 1893. Katie was 18 years old when she married 25 year old Harry F. Landis on July 25<sup>th</sup> 1911 in York Pennsylvania. <sup>29</sup> Harry Filbert Landis was born January 19<sup>th</sup> 1886 to Charles M. Landis and Mary Elizabeth Blouser. <sup>30</sup> He stood 5' 6", and weighed 185 pounds with blue eyes and brown hair. <sup>31</sup>

By 1920 Harry worked as a machinist for the American Chain Company, and the family lived at 656 Princess Street in York Pennsylvania. By 1930 the Harry was a machinist for an Ice factory, and the family continued to live on Princess Street. By 1940 the family had moved to 978 East Philadelphia Street in York.

By the time Harry registered for the WW II draft in April of 1942, the family lived at 172 Newberry Street in York, where Harry was still working for the York Ice Machine Corporation.<sup>32</sup>

Katie died in 1964, and was laid to rest at the Prospect Hill cemetery: FAG#:100273197

Harry died in 1969, and was laid to rest at Prospect Hill. FAG#:100273192

Katie and Harry Landis's children included:

- a. Evelyn E. Landis was born about 1912. She married to Swartz, and by 1940 she was divorced. With her children; Gloria (b.1932) and Ameila (b.1933) they lived with Evelyn's parents at 978 East Philadelphia Street in York.
- b. Nelson F. Landis was born about 1918.
- c. Charles Landis was born about 1927, and was still living with his parents in 1940, at 978 East Philadelphia Street in York.

- vii. Edward Benjamin<sup>33</sup> Einsig was born May 7<sup>th</sup> 1898<sup>vi</sup> to John Einsig and Elizabeth Ritter<sup>34</sup> in York Pennsylvania.
  - Edward always went by the name of Matson, and it may be due to circumstances surrounding the year that Edward was born. No other child born to John and Lizzie adopted the name Matson.
  - Given the late 18<sup>th</sup> century norms, the educational level of John and Lizzie, Samuel Matson's and Lizzie's adultery cases, and Divorce. Edward may actually be the son of Edward Matson. Elizabeth would have been charged with fornication and bastardy; sex that produced a child.

When Edward signed up for the WW I draft in September 12<sup>th</sup> 1918, he lived with his mother, Mrs. Lizzie Matson, at 323 Gerard Avenue in York. Lizzie was identified as the person who would always know where Edward would be.<sup>35</sup>

Edward was 21 years old when he married 17 year old Minnie Mae Doll on September 27<sup>th</sup> 1919 in York Pennsylvania. Edward used the name Matson on his marriage application, which indicated that he was born to John Einsig and Lizzie Ritter. Minnie was born about 1902 to Harry Doll and Lizzie Ness in York Pennsylvania. Harry Doll was a cabinet maker. <sup>36</sup>

After they married Edward and Minnie lived with her parents and siblings at 224 Newberry Street in York, where Edward worked in a paper mill. By 1930 the Edward and his new family lived at 157 South Newberry Street, and he was working at a machine shop.

In 1940 the family lived at 358 Oak Lane in York, where Edward was working still working as a machinist as a bolt maker for a screw works.

Edward died in June 1982. <sup>37</sup>

Edward (Einsig) and Minnie Matson's children included.

- a. Elsie Pauline Matson was born January 9<sup>th</sup> 1920, and she married Norman Sipe. Elsie died March 15<sup>th</sup> 1988. <sup>38</sup>
- b. Lydia E. Matson was born August 30<sup>th</sup> 1921 in York Pennsylvania. She was married to Mr. Wolf, and they lived at 358 Oak Lane in York Pennsylvania.

Lydia was 28 years old when she died at her home on April 24<sup>th</sup> 1950. She was laid to rest April 27<sup>th</sup> at the Mt. Rose Cemetery in York. Her sister, Minnie M. Matson of 358 Oak Lane in York, was the informant on her death certificate.<sup>39</sup>

- c. Mabel C. Matson was born December 1926. She was 20 years old when she applied for a marriage license on May 28<sup>th</sup> 1945. She married Laverne P. Becker on June 16<sup>th</sup> 1945 in York Pennsylvania. <sup>40</sup> She died prior to 2010.
- d. Kathleen Matson was born November 18<sup>th</sup> 1931, and died March 7<sup>th</sup> 1932 in the York Hospital in York Pennsylvania. March 10<sup>th</sup> at the Mt. Rose Cemetery in York. <sup>41</sup>
- e. Josephine Matson was born in 1932. She died prior to 2010.
- f. Treva I. Matson was born in 1935. When her sister Sandra died in 2010, Treva was married to Mr. Durgin, and she lived in York Pennsylvania.
- g. Sandra Lee Matson was born January 14<sup>th</sup> 1942 in York Pennsylvania. She was baptized April 6<sup>th</sup> 1942 at the United Church of Christ, Trinity United Church of Christ in York Pennsylvania. <sup>42</sup>

Sandra married Larry S. 'Killer' Holtzman. The family lived in York where Sandra worked at the Memorial Hospital, York Suburban School District, and Dallastown School District. She was also a member of the Liberty Social Club.

Larry died November 15<sup>th</sup> 2009, and was laid ot rest at the Mt. Rose cemetery in York. Sandra was 68 years old when she died Wednesday February 3<sup>rd</sup> 2010 in York Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest with her husband at the Mt. Rose Cemetery.<sup>43</sup>

They had no children.
