of May said Kischbauch became very
ill of chronic diarrhea and was taken
to Field Hospital & was afterwards re-
moved to the rear for the purpose of
being sent to some General Hospital
That after the Battle of Coal Harbor
some time in May, this Deponent met

a Soldier a member of the same Corps
and one of the ambulance drivers with
whom he had some slight acquaintance
but whose name he has forgotten who
informed me that he had buried a man
by the name of Paul Kischbauch.
That he knew his name from the fact
of its having been printed on his
arm in red ink and at the
same time handed the deponent a
likeness which he immediately recog-
nized as the portrait of Paul Kisch-
bauch and several letters which were
afterwards sent to Mrs. Kischbauch.
That the deponent stated that Kisch-
bauch had died while being conveyed
in ambulance between Wildenep and
Front Royal and was buried about
four miles from Front Royal.

He further swears that he has
no interest in this claim nor has
he any knowledge of the whereabouts
of the above mentioned driver.

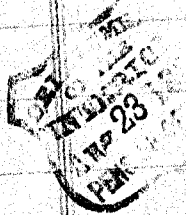

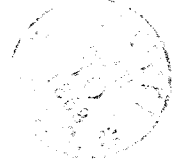

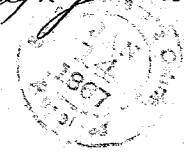
