# Johann Adam Lepley I (1745 - 1831)

Johann Adam Lepley was born and christened February 3<sup>rd</sup> 1748 in Stuttgart, Germany. <sup>1</sup> He went by the name of Adam.

Adam married Barbara Bucher on March 14<sup>th</sup> 1773 in a Lutheran Church in Frederick County Maryland. Barbara was born May 29<sup>th</sup> 1755 to Peter Bucher (Bucherin) in Cumberland County (present day Bedford county). Peter Bucher emigrated on the ship "Loyal Judith" September 3<sup>rd</sup> 1739 from Strassburger Germany.

The first representative of the Lepley family in America came from Germany, accompanied by three sons: Michael, Jacob and Adam, and settled in Eastern Pennsylvania. Michael was killed by the Indians at Bloody Run, now Everett, in Bedford County, Pa. He had three sons. Jacob, who had seven sons and four daughters, moved to Ohio. <sup>2</sup>

Adam and Barbara moved to Knox County Ohio. Adam was 86 years, 6 months, and 20 days old when he died August 26<sup>th</sup> 1831. Barbara was 87 years, and 19 days old when she died April 17<sup>th</sup> 1842. Adam and Barbara were both laid to rest in the Bethel Cemetery in Knox County Ohio. <sup>3</sup>

The entire family as well as Adam's brother and sisters moved to Ohio about 1806. Their son Adam (Adam II) remained in Sommerset County, Pennsylvania where he owned a considerable tract of land.

Adam Lepley and Barbara Bucher had nine children.

# Adam Lepley II (1776 - 1853)

Adam Lepley was born August 5<sup>th</sup> 1776 near Willard's Gap in Larimer Township area of Bedford County Pennsylvania. <sup>4</sup> His name was spelled Adam Lepley; the spelling we have today. Adam was baptized, confirmed, and a member of the Lutheran Church. Adam In 1790 Adam and his family lived in Bedford County, which in 1795 became Somerset County.

Adam married Elizabeth Horn on August 8<sup>th</sup> 1798. Elizabeth was born July 26<sup>th</sup> 1870. The family lived in present day Londonderry and Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania.

He was a farmer, blacksmith, gunsmith known for his fine silver inlays, and a tailor. He also had a still in 1810 according to the tax list, and built a stone house in Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania, which was still standing in 1983.

Adam became a prominent man in the community, and was appointed a Justice of the Peace in 1809 by the Governor of Pennsylvania <sup>5</sup> and served in this capacity for twenty-five years.

Adam died March 7<sup>th</sup> 1853, and Elizabeth died at 82 years old in 1862. They both were laid to rest in the Lepley Cemetery <sup>6</sup> in Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania. <sup>7</sup>

Adam and Elizabeth Lepley had ten children.

- i. Daniel Lepley was born August 12<sup>th</sup> 1799. He moved to Greenville Township Somerset County. Daniel married Elizabeth Beal. Daniel died March 7<sup>th</sup> 1892.
- ii. Jacob Lepley was born June 7<sup>th</sup> 1801
- iii. Valentine Lepley was born April 23<sup>rd</sup> 1803
- iv. Johannah Lepley was born February 2<sup>nd</sup> 1805. She married Michael Korns Jr. Johanna died January 8<sup>th</sup> 1894.
- v. Catherine Lepley was born September 18<sup>th</sup> 1807. She lived with her mother and never married.
- vi. Susannah Lepley was born June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1810
- vii. Joseph Lepley was born November 26<sup>th</sup> 1812. He married Delilah Beal. Joseph died January 18<sup>th</sup> 1878
- viii. Adam Lepley III was born March 5<sup>th</sup> 1821. He married Sarah. He died in 1903 and was laid to rest in the Lepley Cemetery. <sup>8</sup>
- ix. Barbara Lepley was born December 28<sup>th</sup> 1824.

# Valentine Lepley (1803 - 1894)

Valentine (Felty) Lepley <sup>9</sup> was born April 3<sup>rd</sup> 1803 in Wellersburg Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania. He married Lydia Beal, who was born May 20<sup>th</sup> 1810. <sup>10</sup>

Valentine died August 8<sup>th</sup> 1894. He and his wife were laid to rest in the Lepley Cemetery.

The family lived in present day Londonderry and Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania.

Valentine and Lydia Beal had nine children.

- ii. Dennis B. Lepley was born January 6<sup>th</sup> 1830. He died August 3<sup>rd</sup> 1831
- iii. Josiah Valentine Lepley was born August 1<sup>st</sup> 1831. He married Missouri Ohley
- iv. Elizabeth (Betsy) Lepley was born November 23<sup>rd</sup> 1832. She married Dennis Cook. Elizabeth died May 1<sup>st</sup> 1900, and was laid to rest at the Cook Cemetery in Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania. <sup>11</sup>
- v. Hannah Lepley was born November 30<sup>th</sup> 1834
- vi. Susanna Lepley was born August 1<sup>st</sup> 1836. She married Adam Troutman
- vii. John H. Lepley was born November 5<sup>th</sup> 1837. He married Susannah Reiber who died December 16<sup>th</sup> 1919
- viii. Jacob Lepley was born May 5<sup>th</sup> 1839, and died in 1864
- ix. Simon Lepley was born July 29<sup>th</sup> 1840, and died February 20<sup>th</sup> 1846

Lydia Beal-Lepley was 30 years, 10 months, and 9 days old when she died March 22<sup>nd</sup> 1841; shortly after the birth of Simon; most likely from child birth. Lydia was laid to rest in the Lepley Cemetery in Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania. Her headstone had this inscription; Valentine "I live & your son lives too" <sup>12</sup>

Valentine remarries to Maria Baker, who was born June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1823 in Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania. Maria died at 61 years old when she died March 4<sup>th</sup> 1884. <sup>13</sup> Valentine died August 8<sup>th</sup> 1894 in Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania. <sup>14</sup>

Valentine Lepley and Maria Baker had 13 children.

- x. Lydia Lepley was born November 29<sup>th</sup> 1844. She married Nathaniel Bittner. Lydia died September 14<sup>th</sup> 1914, and was laid to rest in the White Oak Church Cemetery.
- xi. Daniel Valentine Lepley was born February 10<sup>th</sup> 1846. When his sister, Lydia, died, Daniel lived in Adamsville, Ohio. <sup>15</sup>
- xii. Amos Lepley was born June 14<sup>th</sup> 1847, and died April 16<sup>th</sup> 1863.
- xiii. Lavina Lepley was born May 1848. She married Joe Shoemaker.
- xiv. Augustus Lepley was born August 8<sup>th</sup> 1851. He married Minerva Bittner. Augusts was 37 years, 1 month and 7 days old when he died September 11<sup>th</sup> 1888. He was laid to rest at the White Oak Cemetery in Larimer Township Somerset County Pennsylvania. <sup>16</sup>
- xv. Eleanor Lepley was born June 16<sup>th</sup> 1853. She married Jesse Kennel who died in March 1908.
- xvi. Millard F. Lepley was born August 6<sup>th</sup> 1856. He married Emma Burkett. When his sister, Lydia, died, Millard was living in Scalp Level, Pennsylvania. <sup>17</sup>
- xvii. Alice Lepley was born March 29<sup>th</sup> 1858. She married William H. Blume. Alice died December 21<sup>st</sup> 1932 in York, York County Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest in Lot 10 of the White Oak Church Cemetery in Salisbury Meyersdale Larimer Township Somerset County Pennsylvania.

- <sup>5</sup> Adam Lepley Justic of the Peace: This is recorded in the Adam Lepley family bible. The bible was printed in 1813 by Frederick Goeb in Somerset, PA. It was one of the first bibles printed in America west of the Allegheny Mountains.
- <sup>6</sup> Lepley Cemetery: The Lepley Cemetery is located in Southampton Township Somerset County Pennsylvania; about three miles north of Wellersburg on the original Lepley Farm.
