Abraham Reece ⁱBigger was born July 30th 1841 to James Bigger and Kathryne Reece in Pennsylvania. His father was born in Ireland, and his mother in Pennsylvania. ¹

Abraham married Mary Stackhouse. ² Mary was born June 16th 1843 to Abraham Stackhouse and Rebecca Kinney in Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. ³

Abraham served in the Civil War with Company I of the 15th Pennsylvania Regiment. He was a farmer and lived with his family in Jordon Township, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania.

Mary was 41 years old when she died May 6th 1885. She was laid to rest in the Salem Cemetery, Unityville, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. FAG#: 45101069 ii

Abraham was 71 years old when he died November 27th 1912 in Jordon Township, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. He was laid to rest in the Salem Cemetery Unityville, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. His son General G. Bigger of Rural Delivery #2 Unityville was the informant on Abraham's death certificate. ⁴ FAG#: 45101063 iii

Henry Ward Bigger (1875-1935)

Henry Ward Bigger was born February 24th 1875 ⁵ to Abraham Bigger and Mary Stackhouse in Lewis Township, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. Both of his parents were born in Pennsylvania. ⁶

Henry was previously married. He then married Emma Rachel ⁷ Smith in 1897, who went by the name Emma. The family lived in Unityville, Jordon Township, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania.⁸ Henry had a medium build, black hair, and brown eyes. ⁹

- Henry's WWI draft card identifies his wife's name as Rachel Emma, but her son Leonard's WWI draft card identified his nearest relative as mother, Emma Rachel. All other records identify her name as Emma, or Emma R.
- Family Oral History: Judy Ross; Emma's middle name was Rachel. I must look at my info from mom. Rachel Smith-Kelly-Bigger was widowed while pregnant with my grandfather Leonard.

Emma Rachel Smith was born August 29th 1870 to William Smith and Sarah Jane Long in Pine Top, Columbia County, Pennsylvania. William was born in Lycoming County, Pennsylvania, and Jane was born in Jordon Township, Lycoming County. ¹⁰ <u>See Smith and Long Research Papers.</u>

In 1900 the family lived next door to Emma's mother Sarah Smith and William Kelley in Jordon Township, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. Then in 1910 Henry and Emma were living with 72-year-old William Kelley and 64-year-old Sarah J. Smith. Sarah indicated she had two children, but only one was still living. I believe this is Emma's mother, Emma and Henry were still living near her relatives, and a daughter, 20-year-old Lizzie Kelley, was living with them.

• Lizzie Kelley may be the daughter of Emma, who may have been previously married

When Henry signed up for the WWI draft in 1918, the family still lived in Unityville where Henry worked as a carpenter for Edward Neufor in Muncy Valley, Sullivan County, Pennsylvania

By 1920s the family moved to 459 Academy Street in Hughsville ^{iv} Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. ¹¹

iv Hughsville is about 14 miles west of Unityville in Lycoming County, Pennsylvania.

Emma was 59 years old when she died from cerebral sclerosis and hemorrhaging on September 14th 1929 in Hughesville, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. She was laid to rest at the Salem Cemetery, Unityville, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. Her husband Henry was the informant on her death certificate. ¹² FAG#: 137603647 ^v

Henry was 60 years old when he died October 6th 1935 from chronic interstitial hepatitis. He was laid to rest at the Salem Cemetery, Unityville, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. His son Grant Bigger of Unityville was the informant on Henry's death certificate. ¹³ FAG#: 133673610 ^{vi}

Henry and Emma Bigger children included. In the 1900 census record, Emma indicated she had five children, but only four were still living. In 1910 Emma indicated she had nine children, but only seven were still living. In 900 Emma indicated she was married to Henry for three years, 1897.

Leonard Kelly (1897-1973)

Leonard Kelly was born October 13th 1897 to Mr. Kelley and Emma Rachel Smith Kelly. Leonard had a medium build, brown hair and eyes. ¹⁷ Leonard's full name went by Leonard Kelley Bigger.

When Leonard signed up for the WWI draft in 1918, he lived Unityville, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania. He worked as a farm hand for G. W. Gardner in Millville, Columbia County, Pennsylvania. He identified his mother, Emma Rachel Bigger of Unityville as his nearest relative. ¹⁸

On August 27th 1929 32-year-old Leonard Kelly Bigger married 28-year-old Marie Dejoice in Ithaca, New York. When he married, Leonard lived at 332 Maple Avenue in Scranton, Pennsylvania. He was working as a laborer in Unityville, Pennsylvania. ¹⁹

- Family Oral History: Judy Ross; Leonard Kelly Bigger married Marie DeJoice Maietta in August 1928, in Ithaca, New York by a Justice of the Peace. Emily Jane was Bigger (my mother) was born October 24, 1929, at the Williamsport Hospital. Leonard and Marie lived at Courson Court in Williamsport. Leonard worked for the city and Marie worked for the Joseph Rhodes family on "Millionaires Row" where she also took care of Mr. Rhode's mother who was 102 years old
- Family Oral History: Judy Ross; My maternal grandmother was named Mary Dejoice, when she was born, however, when the neighbor took her to church for her christening (Lucy couldn't do it at the time) she spoke in broken English and Mary sounded like Marie. My grandmother was known by everyone as Marie for the rest of her life. I noticed in one of my websites they listed my grandmother's date of death in 1996 which is incorrect. She was born March 10, 1902 (don't know the town, it was PA though) and died in CampHill in December 1992.

At the time of her marriage, Marie was doing housework in DuBois, Pennsylvania. 20

Leonard K. Bigger, 75, of Union Avenue, died at 6:15 pm Tuesday, July 31st 1973, in the Divine Providence Hospital, where he was admitted July 8th as a medical patient. He was a member of Boniface Catholic Church. ²²

• Surviving are his wife, the former Marie DeJoice; two sons, Thomas A., of Renovo, and Edward T., of Reading; a daughter, Mrs. Donald Ross, of Camp Hill; two brothers, Harold, of Montoursville, and Chester, of Muncy; and four grandchildren.
