## Nathan Hopf Photo Collection Northern York County School Photos

The following photos are from Dulcet Cortege. They are of a teacher Margaret Baker, and of the Smith and Elicker children, in various schools within the present day Northern York County School District.

There is a book; The Story of the One-Room School: In the Townships of the Northern York County School District, by Dr. Brain Small, that can purchased from the Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society.

- 1911 school; Margaret Baker and her brother Mervin are sitting beside each other to the DC\_(01) left in the front row. Their other brother, Parker Baker, is in the front row 7<sup>th</sup> from the left. The bothers have the same style and pattern of shirts.
- 1923 Dillsburg High School Graduation Class; Margaret Baker is sitting to the left in the DC\_(02) front row. Her brother Mervin is in the back row, 3<sup>rd</sup> from the left. Mervin is one year older then Margaret, but they are graduating together.

The next set of photos is of classes that Margaret Baker taught in the Dillsburg area. If you have the book on the one room schools in Dillsburg, you'll see her name in the listing of teachers.

Margaret Baker Class, one of the 1<sup>st</sup> classes she would have taught after her 1923 high DC (03) school graduation.

The next 2 school pictures are of the Smith children attending school, which we're pretty sure is a school that sat directly across the road from present day South Mountain Elementary, where Northern Apartments are located.

- DC\_(08) Circa 1913 School; Glenn Smith is in the 2<sup>nd</sup> row, 2<sup>nd</sup> from the left. His sister Hazel Smith may be the girl in the back row, against the brick wall, 2<sup>nd</sup> from left.
- DC\_(10) Circa 1914 School; Glenn Smith is 2<sup>nd</sup> row, far left. Other Smith children would be in here too, but they can't be identified.

This set is the Elicker children attending school. DC (12) is clearly labeled Glenwood 1902. DC (13) is marked 1910, and it may be the school in Dillsburg. DC (14) is a photo of a large number of students, which is dated circa 1913. We're still researching all of the photos.

- DC\_(15) Central School September 28<sup>th</sup> 1950; Karen Smith is in the 2<sup>nd</sup> row, far left. Her sister, Carol Smith, is in the 3<sup>rd</sup> row, 3<sup>rd</sup> from the left.
